



And finally, if you fancied children's clothing or small fashions, in 1930 retailers featured dresses with two pockets to accent the circular skirt, one-piece frock with an open cape, a frock ensemble with pleats in front and an open jacket, a little girl's frock with a scalloped shoulder cape, and a coat becoming to any small child gathered to a round yoke fastened with buttons.

For back-to-school fashions, you found a coat for a little girl, simply made with raglan sleeves, a double breasted front closure, patch pockets worn with a round hat.



For young boys, they emphasized a smart coat cut slightly different from the little girl's but similar in style, had slot pockets, notched collar and was worn with a round sectional cap.

Hello Model A Friends -

I am pleased to finally be able to provide a Registration Form for this year's **2021 (not necessarily annual) Fun with Dick and Jane Tour**. This year we will visit the Augusta, Georgia and Aiken, South Carolina areas. Our host hotel will be the Crown Plaza, located at 1060 Center Street, North Augusta, S.C., and reservations may be made using the group name of "**Model A Tour Group**". **Reservations calls should be directed to Ms. Jeannine Steinkuhl at (803) 349-8406**. Since the Crown Plaza will not recognize a room block, rooms will be available only on a first come-first served basis. Room rates for our group start at \$129.00/night plus taxes and \$9.00/night charges for covered parking. Trailer parking will be available a short distance from the hotel. Because of our inability to obtain a room block from the Crown Plaza, I would encourage those interested in joining us to go ahead and make their room reservations as soon as possible! We will hold the cut-off date open for the tour itself through Tuesday, August 31, 2021.

This year's event anticipates an arrival on Thursday, September 16, with a departure on Sunday, September 19th. The tour itself will begin on Friday, September 17th starting with a tour of the Augusta Canal Museum, followed by a boat tour down the Augusta Canal. Upon our return, we will head across the alleyway to Fatman's for a buffet lunch. Our next stop will be Meadow Garden, home of George Walton, one of the three signers of the Declaratoin of independence from Georgia. From there, we will visit the Augusta Cultural Center based in a turn-of-the-century Roman Catholic Church. Our final stops on Friday will be the Joseph Lamar (Associate Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court) and Woodrow Wilson boyhood homes. Our buffet dinner that evening will be at the B J Country Buffet.

Saturday morning will begin with a tour of Redcliff Plantation (ca. 1857), afterwhich we will return to Aiken for a quick tour of the Aiken Train Depot (ca. 1895 replica). After lunch we will head to the Aiken Historical Museum, and will wrap up the day's tour with a visit to Hopeland Gardens. Dinner on Saturday evening will be at Sconyers (Barbeque) Restaurant.

I hope that you will consider joining us for this year's event.



The Tech Corner



Jim's technical tip

Mechanic's Gloves are Great!

I resisted wearing mechanic's gloves for many years when working on my old cars. I didn't think I needed them. Let me tell you, I was wrong! They are great!

I found a pack of 15 pair of work gloves on Amazon for \$10 last year, and I am now a believer. They are branded "Grease Monkey". They are red woven gloves that have dipped the fingers and palm into a rubbery polymer that gives grip and protection. You can use them and when they get too greasy, dirty, or torn up, you throw them away and don't feel too bad, because they're only 75 cents a pair.



They help me grip things better, they keep my hands cleaner, the open weave does not make my hand sweat too much, and I am now avoiding a lot of the scrapes, cuts and bruises that I used to get when working on my cars. I do have to remove them for very fine work, but for most of my wrenching, they really help.

And after using them for a year now, I have another low-tech Tech Tip for you: Take a black marker and draw a 3" to 4" line up the back of the left glove every time you pull a new pair out of the package. When you grab a pair off the bench or out of a toolbox to put on, you will quickly spot that black line up the back of the left glove and get the gloves on the right hand the first time. (Lefts and rights look identical at first glance.)

For 75 cents, you'll throw a pair in each car, in your toolbox, and out in the tool shed. What a deal! Until next time,
