November 7-10, 2019

Our Fall Directors' Tour to Thomasville in early November was a wonderful success, enjoyed by all participants. There we partook of good Southern cooking, and primarily the specialty of the house at Ms. Betty's Fried Chicken. The owner was tickled to have us there, especially enjoying the cars.

The casino building that was at the center of the resort was destroyed by flooding in the 1990's but the footprint has been preserved, sitting at street level above the terraced gardens and spring. The "remains" are a bit rough around the edges, but you can still get a sense of its earlier grandeur, aided by informational plaques placed throughout. A fun and interesting stop.

After arriving in Thomasville, itself a famous resort from the late 1800's into the early part of the 20th century, we



Next stop was to Radium Springs Gardens. This unusual venue was the location of a popular resort in the 20's and 30's, where a natural spring offered the focal point for rest and relaxation. It played a large role in the history of the local Indians, who valued the special properties of the waters, which flow into the Flint River and eventually out to the gulf.



were on our own to explore the downtown where we also partook of a nice dinner at the local Sweet Grass Dairy Cheese shop and restaurant.

The next day we did more exploring before heading to nearby Cairo, GA, for lunch at a local institution, Mr. Chick, owned since the 70's by Wayne and Rosa Hadden,

longtime car enthusiasts. After having lunch we went to the adjacent museum collection of the Hadden's, complete with a personal tour. In three buildings we feasted on fabulous vintage cars and memorabilia of all descriptions.



Saturday took us to the fabulous Pebble Hill Plantation, first established for farming in the 1800's and later became a "shooting" plantation where visitors could spend a vacation hunting fowl on the extensive land. The property was managed by strong women of their day. The the last owner, Elizabeth "Pansy" Poe, provided for the plantation to become a private

foundation, complete with the home retaining



everything as it had been at the time of her death. Visitors today can get a wonderful glimpse into the lifestyle of this unique place, which includes the home, barns, stables, gardens, and more. Andy having box lunches on the front porch was the perfect ending to our special time.

We spent our last evening at a famous local seafood restaurant, and enjoyed reviewing our time in this lovely jewel of a town at the southern end of our state. A return visit will be on our personal list.




November Tech Meet – Another success!




