

Reservations need to be made no later than Monday, July 20th, by calling/texting Jackie Peterson at 404-863-2468.



#### The Tech Corner



#### Installing New Radiator Hoses


Heat takes a toll on the radiator hoses, especially the upper hose. The radiator hoses on a Model A can be a pain to install, particularly the lower ones with the pipe. Here are a few tips I have picked up to make the job easier.

Use a lubricating non-hardening sealant inside the hose ends to make it easier to slide them on to the engine and radiator necks, and easier to move them around when you need to. The best one that I have found is called Hylomar AF (I get it from W.W. Grainger). A thin coating inside the hose helps it slide around when installing, and will also make it easier to remove in the future.

On the lower pipe, install one short hose on each end of the pipe and secure each with a clamp. Estimate where you want the hoses to be, but be prepared to move them later after a trial fitting. Slide the hose end first on to the radiator outlet at the bottom and slide it far forward. Then work the other end's hose over the cast iron water inlet and slide up. Feel through the hose to find the bead on the inlet and clamp on the engine side of the bead. Then tighten the clamp at the radiator.

The upper hose uses a similar technique. Slide the hose first down on the cast iron engine gooseneck. Carefully work the other end over the radiator inlet and slide it up. Then position the hose clamps near the end of the hose and tighten them.

Do not over tighten the hose clamps, especially the ones on the radiator. If you do, you can buckle and crush the thin brass, and you will cut into the hoses. You should not have to make the clamps too tight if you use some sealant. Start out with them just snug and then only tighten more if coolant drips from the hose when the system is full. After driving a few times, go back and check the clamps, snug them up a bit if needed.





Jim DeliaRatta never figured himself for a car guy. Then he restored the Model T his wife's uncle had owned since the 1950s.





#### Jim DellaRatta

1924 Ford Model T

In the early 1950s, my wife's uncle bought this 1924 Model T in New York. By the end of the decade, he'd disassembled the car down to every nut and bolt with plans to restore it. Then he left for the army, got married, and had children. The T sat in his garage until 1985, when he and his family moved to Florida. Then it sat in that garage until 2017, when I flew to Florida to pick it all up and bring it back to New York.

First, I sorted through all the parts and pieced everything together. For guidance, I joined the Model T Ford Club of America and the Antique Automobile Club of America. I also discovered Lang's Old Car Parts, a Model T specialist.

My brother-in-law joined me in the restoration, which became a great bonding experience, and the T began to take shape. We started with the front end first, then moved to the rear end, learning how the whole drivetrain worked in the process. We wanted the engine done properly, so we took it to an expert. Once we had it back, we assembled the transmission and mounted it to the motor; it took four guys to lift them into place in the chassis. With the drivetrain in, we added the tires and had ourselves a rolling chassis. As the pile of remaining pieces got smaller and smaller, it became easier to figure out what went where. When it came time for the upholstery and top, I did them myself.

Almost exactly one year into the restoration, I put the key in, and the T started for the first time. Hearing it run was such a sense of accomplishment, especially for this previously non-car guy. Learning to drive it was a little difficult, but I've got the hang of it now, and I tool around the neighborhood frequently. I've started to bring it to shows, too. I'm excited to see what comes next.

America's Sweetheart will be on display for Model A Day, September 18-19, 2020.






**NOTICE FROM ROAD AND TRACK.COM:** The Harbor Freight jack stands that we've all bought, borrowed or seen in our friends' garages are being recalled due to a risk of collapsing under load. Go check yours immediately.

In a recall filed with the NHTSA on March 20 of this year, Harbor Freight explains that certain 6-ton jack stands have the potential to disengage their support pawl under shifting weight, causing the stand to drop suddenly. A second recall, filed May 3, extends the recall to 3-ton jack stands. The defect is attributed to aging tooling at the factory that produced the jack stands.

The recall document says that the problem could affect more than 450,000 6-ton jack stands produced between 2013 and 2019 and nearly 1.3 million 3-ton jack stands produced between 2012 and 2020. These jack stands were sold under the Pittsburg brand name, and can be identified by item numbers 56371 or 61196 on 3-ton models, and 61197 on 6-ton models.



Harbor Freight urges anybody in possession of affected jack stands to return them to the store in exchange for a gift card equal to the price of the stands. Any unsold jack stands covered by the recall have been removed from stores. Check on your buddies and spread the word around—these jack stands are ubiquitous, and a failure like this could be fatal.




#### **FUN CALENDAR!**


