

Beautiful Savannah and Historic Richmond Hill in March! Arrival Thursday, March 22, departure Sunday, March 25.

UPDATE and some **DETAILS: March 22nd** will be a travel day for all those going. Naturally, we will have two groups. Those that <u>trailer their cars</u> to the hotel should make arrangements to be at the hotel by mid-afternoon for check-in. There is plenty of room at the hotel for the expected number of trailers.

FOR THOSE DRIVING MODEL A's:

MEET: 8:30 AM, and **prompt departure at 9:00am. Flash Food Gas Station**, 8075 Wells St, Senoia, GA 30276, **at the corner of State 85 and 16 in Senoia at 8:30 am for a** Everyone should have used the facilities and topped off their gas tanks prior to leaving at 9. Here is the address for Flash Foods:

NOTE: We will not gas up again for 132 miles, so make certain that your car is full before leaving the Flash Foods.

Detailed driving instructions will be given out at our start point. We will pick up additional participants at Monticello, Ga. just off Hwy 16, about 1 hour after we leave Senoia. There will be no gas at this location and we do not intend to stop long. Those needing to take a quick bathroom break should do it here.

We will have about six cars from this point. We need to try and stay together, but leave enough distance between cars for sudden or unexpected stops. I will lead and will maintain a speed of about 45 - 50 mph.

THURS. EVENING: We don't have a formal sit down dinner on Thursday evening but there are a number of chain restaurants in the area. There is a Cracker Barrel next door to the hotel ... the shortest walk to a place to eat.

FRIDAY: A day in Savannah. Dinner at Pirate's House.

The meeting probably should occur the beginning of April.



MODEL A STEERING MYSTERY SOLVED!

Southside A's Tech Meet - Reported by Bob Simpson

Seventeen members of the Southside A's met at Technical Director Tom Romine's shop on Saturday morning February 10th to learn about the Model A steering system. Coffee and donuts started things off and we got to talk and visit a little while before getting down to business.






The Model A steering system can be intimidating. Many Model A's are driven around with excessive play in the wheel, stiff or binding steering and other issues. Most of us are hesitant to tear into the steering gear assembly to replace worn parts. Also, attempts to make adjustments to

the steering system can damage parts and make things worse if not done properly. Over the years, many systems have either not been lubricated at all or grease has been used instead of the proper oil.

Tom Romine guided us through a complete rebuild of a 2 tooth steering gear and all steering column components. Dick Carne provided the worn out steering column and

gear. He also wrote the check for the replacement parts! The group enjoyed seeing and participating in the work. If you need to give your steering some attention, our vendors can supply all the parts needed to repair or rebuild it. There are kits available for a complete rebuild or separate components can be obtained if just certain parts are bad and need to be replaced.



When the seminar was over we enjoyed a great lunch of Chili Dogs, chips, slaw and some delicious baked goods. Thank you Liz Romine! After lunch Director Jim Wingo went over tour destinations,

activities and dates for this year. He asked the group to pass along ideas for future Technical Seminars to Tom Romine and thanked him for the great job he is doing.





Jack and Drena Miller: This month we feature Jack and Drena Miller, **What** longtime vintage car officionados. Here they are with their lovely 1931 A-400.

These two have embraced the car hobby with gusto and their enthusiasm is contagious.






FUEL SHUT-OFF VALVE

Easy removal or installation of Model A fuel shutoff valve from Model A gas tanks can be accomplished by procuring a 5/8 x 14 thread nut (NF) and hand tighten it on the outlet of the valve. This gives a surface to use a wrench without damaging the threads.

A quick, easy way to install a flywheel starter ring instead of using a torch is as follows: CAUTION: Do this outdoors and it works just as well in a barbeque pit or stand. Place the ring on the cardboard carton it came in or a pile of cardboard. In the center of the ring pour some charcoal lighter fluid or some flammable solvent and ignite it Be ready, when the box is just ashes and hot coals, remove the ring with pliers and sit it on the flywheel. Another word of caution - make sure you have the ring facing the correct direction. It usually falls all the way on for me.

BARBER & TALLADEGA RACE TRACK ADVENTURE



MARCH 15-17

You are invited to attend the Central Alabama Model "A" Ford club's Race Track Adventure March 15- 17 2018. The meeting will be filled with a lot of activities of fun & excitement including kicking tires with fellow club members from around the south, dinner in a great Model "A" Ford Museum, visiting the Barber Motorsports recently expanded museum and the opportunity to put your Model "A" Ford on the Motorsports track for several laps.

For attendees who have never visited the Talladega Speedway an early bird option will be offered, a bus tour of the Talladega Speedway and a visit to the International Motor Sports Hall of Fame museum.

THURSDAY March 15, 2018 (EARLY BIRD OPTION) Arrival and check in at the motel Visit local antique stores looking for those great finds you just cannot do without. Prepare Friday morning visit to the Talladega Super Speedway tour. The speedway track is 2.66 miles long with 33 degree bank turns, seats 175,000 people and cost \$4 million dollars to build. The museum tour is a walking self-guided tour that takes approximately an hour to complete the three exhibit halls. A 12 seat bus leaves every 20 minutes for a tour of the track.

FRIDAY March 16, 2018 Early bird option members depart for the Talladega Super Speedway. Other tour attendee's arrival and check in at the motel. Visit local antique stores looking for those great finds you just cannot do without. The fun will continue Friday evening with the welcome dinner at 6:00 p.m. with some good "ole" Model "A" fellowship, 50/50 drawing, picking and grinning with the Dan Nelson Players in Gerald Grizzard's Model "A" Ford Museum, 1 mile from the host motel.

SATURDAY March 17, 2018. After breakfast 7:30 to 7:50 a.m. we will assemble in the parking lot of the Lone Star Restaurant (Across from the Motel), at 8:00 a.m. we will depart for the Barber Motorsports Museum and Track (To arrive by 9:30 a.m.) The trip to the Barber Complex will take about an hour and half along a scenic route provided in your packet.
