

Saturday, February 15, 2020



First Tech Meet of the Year





On Saturday the 8th of February we discussed ignition trouble shooting. In order to understand this topic, we discussed different electrical testing meters. A cheap \$6.00 meter will work, for these tests, as well as a \$400.00 unit.

We discussed how to properly terminate wire terminal connectors.



We also ooked at a table demonstration of the Model 'A' Ignition System, in order to show different points to be tested. Discussed the importance of the Points and the Condenser; how burnt points will give additional resistance to the circuit, which in turn will lower the voltage to the coil and the plugs. If the condenser is shorted, you will not have power to the points, and not allow the coil to fire.

The ignition circuit is basically the same for 6-volt systems or for 12-volt systems. Just the rating is different on the components. Everyone seemed to learn something from this topic. (Next Tech Meet, May 9. Mark your calendar!)



Booth Western Art Museum – April 18-19 Overnight tour to Cartersville



Whether you are a Western history buff, a lover of Georgia history, art lover, antique shopper, or any other persuasion, you're sure to enjoy this overnight tour in the lovely month of April.

We will travel the backroads (some from Palmetto, others from LaGrange, converging on the way) Saturday morning. After arriving in Cartersville around noon, your time will be your own to explore the world-class Booth Museum, possibly taking a guided tour that is offered at 1:30 in the afternoon.


Head out the back entrance and you are steps away from the historic downtown of Cartersville where you'll pass by the beautiful Bartow History Museum, also a worth stop to explore 200 years of local history in the original courthouse building. You might hear or see a train roll by on the nearby tracks as you take a leisurely stroll past the shops, both modern and antique, restaurants, and landmark buildings. Lunch can be enjoyed either at the Booth Museum Café, or at any one of the offerings around the square.

That evening we will gather together for dinner at a restaurant near our hotel, about a fifteen minute drive from the Museum area, and share tales of the day's adventures. Sunday morning we will head home, taking a different route that's sure to please.

The Tech Corner

Jim's Tech Tip by Jim Cannon Check Your Oil Filler Pipe and Cap

Many Model A owners experience excessive oil leaks when driving their car, often out the rear main seal. One simple thing that can cause this is a restriction in the oil filler pipe. Take the cap off and look down the pipe with a good light. You should only see a series of little metal baffles, half-moon in shape, inside the filler pipe. If you find where someone has covered the pipe with a sock, or stuffed a piece of cloth down in the filler pipe to stop oil from coming out the filler when driving, this will put pressure inside the crankcase and force oil out the rear main seal while you drive. Easy to fix: get that stuff out of there!



While you have it off, also inspect the inside of the oil filler cap. It, too, needs to be clear inside. No pieces of steel wool, pot scrubber, or old sock in the cap! Look for evidence of someone accidentally pushing the oil filler cap on too far. When you do, you bend the little tabs inside the cap and mash it all the way down on the pipe. This blocks the engine's ability to vent the crankcase, builds up pressure, and causes a bad leak out the rear main seal.

I hope this little tip helps you stop that oil leak while driving. Have a Model A Day! Jim


Sunday. The public also will have an opportunity to meet B-17 crewmen and other World War II veterans during the weekend, which this year is dedicated to the 75th anniversary of the end of WWII." – Press release.

The organizers of this year's Heritage Days would like to have pre-war vehicles on display one or both days for the event. Participants will receive free admission as well as lunch for sharing their cars. You may bring one guest, however, both people need to register separately in order to take part. **Go to wwiidays.org to register**.

They would like to have cars there both days but it is not mandatory. The Georgia State Defense Force will be on site overnight for security. There are about 20 military vehicles that will be left overnight.

There is also a swing dance on Saturday night with reduced rate tickets for "volunteers" (any participant with a car is considered a volunteer). Once you register on line, an email will be sent with the dance ticket website in case you would like to attend the dance on Saturday night at a reduced rate (\$45.00 pp instead of \$75.00 pp) while tickets last. They sell out fast!







