The grounds are beautiful and extensive, and we will have a picnic lunch after touring the main house and the upstairs art gallery. The gardens and outbuildings are self-guided and well worth your time.

We will also enjoy lunch at the famous Mr. Chick in nearby Cairo, followed by a tour of the owner's truly spectacular private car and memorabilia collection, located behind the restaurant.

Thomasville is a lovely walk-able, charming town featuring shopping, antiquing and a variety of eating (and ice cream!) offerings. You will have free time to explore and relax around our planned activities.

On our tour from Sam's Club heading south, we'll stop for lunch in Butler, Ga, at a local institution - Ms. Betty's Fried Chicken on the square. Continuing on the road we'll make a brief stop in Albany to visit "One of Georgia's Seven Natural Wonders," Radium Springs Gardens. With an interesting history going back to Indian settlements in the area, it became a popular tourist destination in the early 20th century, boasting swimming in the clear springs, a hotel and a casino (no gambling; just entertainment). Bobby Jones even played an exhibition match at the resort's golf course. Today you can see the outlines and remnants of the resort and still watch fish swimming in the clear water.

Their first tour was to Moultrie, Georgia, and our club was invited to participate, along with the Atlanta Region of the Horseless Carriage Club (lots of Model T's) and the Georgia Region of Model A Restorers. We had seven members/families of the 42 cars in attendance--Jim Wingo, Tom Romine, Jack & Drena Miller, Larry & Jackie Peterson, Tom & Betty Miller, Mark & Marilyn Corley, and Gareth & Debra Eich.

**Now about the tour.** First, what a great location! Not just Moultrie, but also the time we spent in the small and not so small towns of South Georgia. They ordered some great weather for us, 80 degrees or better every day and no rain. Those A and T folks must have some great contacts.

The organization for the daily tours was somewhat different than what we have experienced on other tours and it worked well. Each day we were presented with our destination address and expected arrival (or multiple stops for that day). Model T's should leave earlier, Model A's later. No planned caravans or turn by turn directions.

## Highlights:

**Monday**--Pope's Museum - Women of Achievement, emphasis on the importance of the arts , civic pride and historic preservation. Other stops were Collins Pecan Store and Dillon Candy Store, enough said.

**Tuesday**--Toto Antique lamps in the small town of Ochlocknee. They have high end antiques, lamps, shades, and... In the rear of the building some beautiful antiques autos, apparently permanent fixtures, to include two Rolls Royces, a Franklin and a very nice Mercedes among others. Then on to Mr Chick. The owner has a fantastic collection of antique autos, trucks and memorabilia. The food was excellent, good fried chicken and best pork chop ever! Another optional stop was Gin Creek winery .

**Wednesday**--To Thomasville for a tour of the history center, some beautiful historic buildings and lunch in the downtown. Great restaurants! Photo Op with the Thomasville live oak tree, 336+ years old. Other interesting visits were the Black History Museum and the 1861 Distillery.

**Thursday**--Drive to Nashville, GA. This is the home of Ron Ganster's Restoration Shop. He is well known in Georgia/Florida, has a great stable of cars and trucks and furnishes cars for the motion picture industry. Other stops--The Horse Creek Winery. We had a catered seafood dinner at the hotel. Wow!

**Friday**--We missed the Friday tour to Pebble Hill Plantation. Plan to attend the Southside A's Thomasville Tour next month and see for yourself.

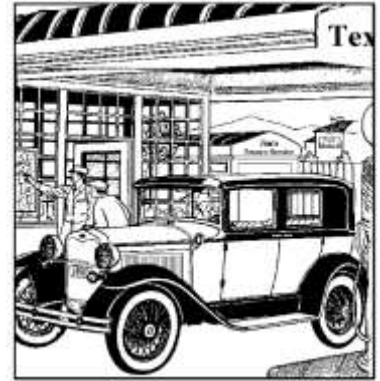
Jim is working on his Roadster and it needs oil and lubrication and maybe brake adjustment, so we will do that for him in exchange for the use of his garage, lol.

# ATLANTA HISTORY CENTER TOUR

Saturday, March 25, 2023



Southside A's will be joining in with the Goldmine and Georgia Regions for this wonderful day-tour to the Atlanta History Center. Since the Center is located up in the city this will be a modern-car tour, and we will simply meet up there. However, if any intrepid folks would like the experience, feel free to drive you're A! Either way, you will have much to explore at this destination. A couple of highlights:

The History Center is now the home to the fully restored **Cyclorama** painting, "The Battle of Atlanta." Created by 17 German artists, the Cyclorama debuted in Minneapolis in 1886, and relocated to Atlanta in 1892. At forty-nine feet tall and longer than a football field, visitors get to be immersed in the history.

We will also be able to tour the **Swan House**, home to the Inman family and designed by architect Phillip Tramell Shutze in 1928. Housed on the Terrace Level of the house is the varied and beautiful decorative arts collection of the architect.

For lunch we will visit the charming **Swan Coach House**, home to a restaurant, gift shop and art gallery.

**COST:** \$15/per person.

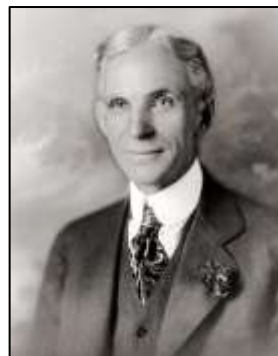

This month we are featuring page 1 of another article from Jill Barrett, Santa Clara Valley Chapter of MAFCA, highlighting the year 1931 in Model A fashions.

### **Looking One's Loveliest in 1931** *A Pictorial Summary of Model 'A' Fashions*

When historians refer to the 1930's, we read about 'the great depression'. Songwriters were asking, "Brother can you spare a dime?" But fashion dictators were trending feminine hairstyles, wider shoulders, narrow hips and evening wear with a new emphasis on the back. In 1931, dresses were charming, graceful, slenderizing and exuded femininity.

The dropped waist was gone. The waistline was worn higher at the natural line and belts were worn tighter. Hemlines were one to two inches longer than the previous year falling at the mid-calf and for the most part were straight although uneven hems were seen on "Sunday Supper", semi-formal and other formal afternoon fashions.

Sleeveless dresses had matching jackets or boleros. Dresses with short sleeves were here to stay. Semi-formal dresses had capped sleeves, short elbow length sleeves or a shallow cape attached.

Dresses were seen in black, shades of dark brown, wine, maroon, rose and a variety of dark greens. Black or navy blue were combined with white, pastels or bright colors and were important spring and summer colors. Shades of tan and brown were mixed with colors in a print or as an accent. Ornamental bows and flowers of earlier years weren't as common but were seen on semi-formal and formal dresses.

**BYLAW CLARIFICATION:** Below please find page 2 of the Southside A's Bylaws, Restated as of January, 2023, indicating a simple clarification to Article III, Section 4. We are required to publish changes when there is a restatement, and this fulfills that requirement. We will send out the finished copy, incorporating these edits, to the membership immediately.

## ARTICLE III

### Members

**SECTION 1.** Classes of members, voting rights, active members and family members:

(A) Active members shall be entitled to receive the Southside A's Club publication, any other notices of Club Membership activities, and shall have the right to vote on a "one-vote-per-household" basis, at all General and Special meetings of the Club's members.

(B) Family membership shall be issued to the immediate family of an active member. Family members must be of the same household as the active member. Family members have all rights and privileges of active members, but will not receive the Club's publications, nor shall there be any additional voting privileges extended beyond the one-vote-per-household limit referenced in Section One (A) above.

(C) All members must be members of MARC.

**SECTION 2.** Active membership shall not be limited to owners of Model A Fords, but all members should have a genuine interest in the hobby.

**SECTION 3.** Membership qualifications:

(A) All applicants must submit an application for membership;

(B) All applicants must agree to abide by the Bylaws of the Club;

(C) All applicants must be approved by the Board of Directors.

**SECTION 4.** Dues:

(A) The Board shall establish the amount of annual Club dues. Any change in the amount of annual Club dues shall be subject to the approval of two-thirds of the **Board\*** members present at a regular Board meeting. ~~for which advance notice shall be given pursuant to Article XII.~~
