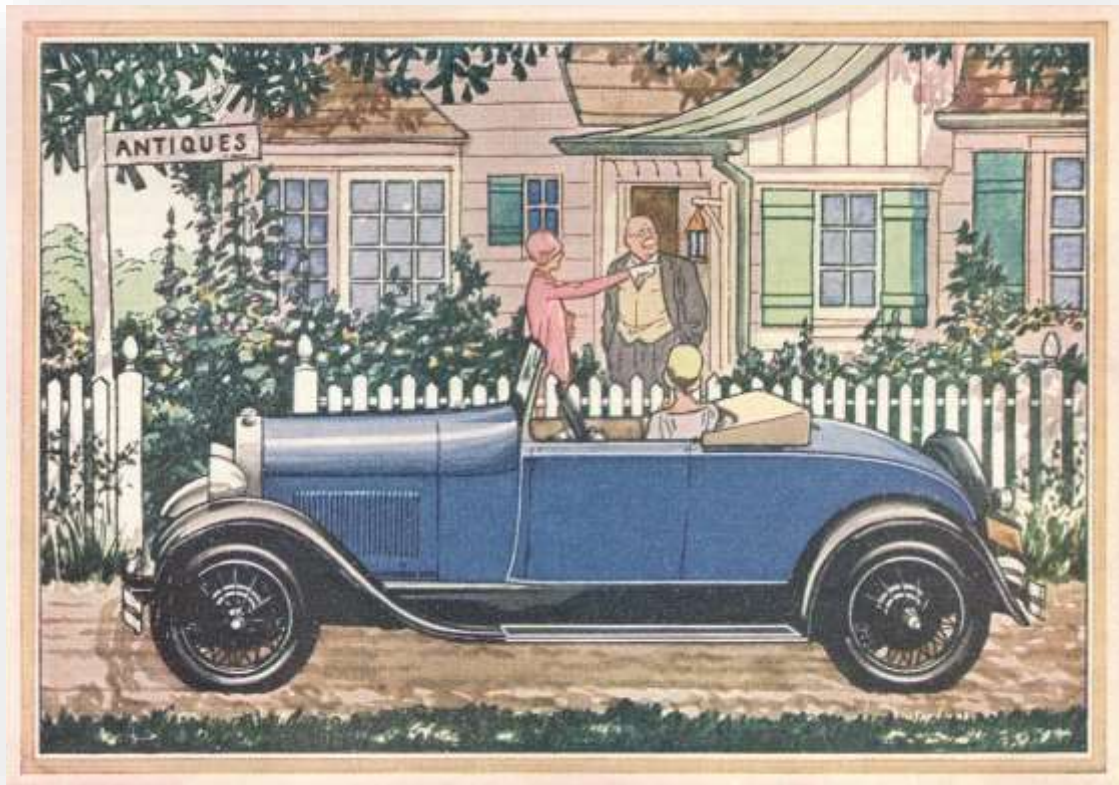

## Thoughts from Our Director

Hello Model A'ers,

I hope this letter finds you well and eagerly anticipating the arrival of spring weather. As is customary during this time of year, I want to encourage each of you to conduct a routine safety check on your cars. Not only is this a wise undertaking, but it can also unveil any hidden mechanical issues that might have gone unnoticed.

Remember on-the-side-of-the-road repairs can be dangerous and earn you the chicken award!

Here is a checklist of tasks that you should consider:

1. Tire check: Thoroughly examine tire pressure and tread depth. Ensure proper inflation and adequate tread for safe driving.
2. Fluid level assessment: Verify the levels of crucial fluids such as engine oil, transmission fluid, rear end, coolant, and steering box. If you haven't changed your coolant for a year or more, now's the time to change it.
3. Brake inspection: Evaluate the condition of brake pads and test braking efficiency in emergency situations. If you're unsure on how to do this, please reach out. Ensure that the brakes are functioning flawlessly.
4. Lights examination: Perform a comprehensive check of headlights, brake lights, turn signals, and taillights to guarantee their proper functioning.
5. Battery evaluation: Inspect battery terminals for any signs of corrosion and assess battery voltage. If required, clean the terminals and charge the battery.
6. Fan belt inspection: Examine the belt closely and replace it if it shows any signs of wear or damage.
7. Front end scrutiny: Pay attention to shocks, tie rods, spindles, and kingpins, ensuring their optimal condition.
8. Make sure to lubricate grease points based on the recommended Ford service bulletins. The chart for those can be found on the Internet.

Naturally, despite your checks, there is always the possibility of experiencing a breakdown while on the road. In such an event, it would be wise to assemble a troubleshooting toolbox. I have enclosed a listing of parts and tools that I use. While it may not include every single part you might require, its contents cover many of the common problems encountered during tours. These problems can be easily addressed with the proper parts and tools.

Let's strive for a safe and enjoyable driving experience this touring season. Should you have any questions or need further assistance, please don't hesitate to reach out.

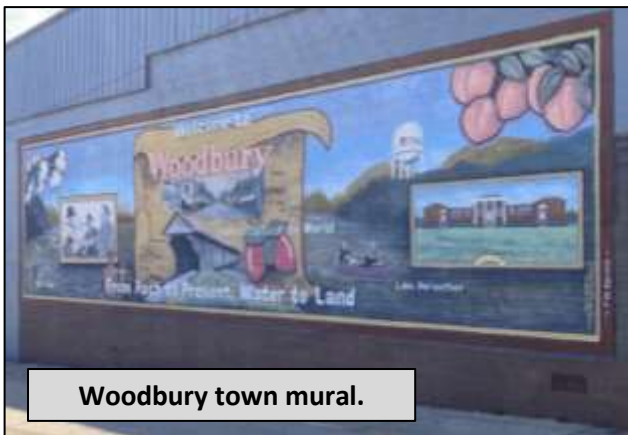
## Valentine's Lunch

# February Tech Meet

We met at the workshop of Jim Hunter for this Tech Meet. Larry Peterson wanted to change the gear ratio in the rear axle on his roadster. He brought the axle, with the idea of installing a 3:54 gear set.

After disassembling and cleaning, we replaced the axle shaft seals as well as the drive shaft seal. Next, we started to assemble the carrier with the ring gear and new bearings. Installing the carrier in the banjo and both axle housings, we determined how much total shimming was need: .036.

Next, we removed the carrier and built up the drive shaft and pinion, then reassembled the axle, pinion and carrier with the axle housings. After that we started to shim the housing to the .036 previously determined. But then we began to run into problems. We could not get the gear mesh pattern correct.

As sometimes happens, we had to put the work on hold until a later date, and order some other parts.

We were rewarded for the working and learning with pizza for lunch, graciously set up by Ann Hunter and Liz Romine, who also generously contributed fruit as well as homemade brownies and cookies.

This was one of our best attended Tech Meets, with over 20 enthusiasts present. And the consensus was that we all learned a lot...the ultimate goal of our meets.



**List of parts and tools for common brake-downs and on the road maintenance. Listed in no particular order. Remember this is a building process, you don't need to get these all at once.**

- A. Extra distributor that has been timed to your car.
- B. Extra carburetor that has been run and tuned on your car for at least 50 miles.
- C. Distributor screw and lock nut A-12127-L and Quick Point gap setter A-12198
- D. Two wrenches 9/16" and 1/2", those sizes on each wrench. One box end and the other open end. These are usually in a set of micro wrenches you can get on Amazon.
- E. New Points and condenser., in the box so you can easily identify them. I use Blue Streak by O-Reilly's FD77 and FD8183V. Call them before you go, they likely will have to order them for you.
- F. A set of spark plugs pre-gapped.
- G. A timing wrench by Nu-Rex
- H. A circuit test light
- I. A long handle "stubby" flat head screw driver. Craftsman is the only brand I have found this.
- J. Extra new coil.
- K. A hand crank or pulley wrench
- L. A new fan belt
- M. A 20" pry bar
- N. 3/8 drive ratchet and a set of sockets and set of extensions.
- O. Two small wrenches for point changes and adjustment one 9/32 and then other 5/16. Each wrench with boxed end and open.
- P. Cam lubricant for distributor
- Q. Small bottle of 3 in 1 oil.
- R. Extra fuses
- S. Feeler gauge set
- T. Tire gauge
- U. Permatex BLUE treadlocker
- V. Extra timing pin
- W. Rotor, cap and body for distributor
- X. Coil wire
- Y. Half-inch torque wrench. Typical torque is between 35 foot pounds and 125 pounds.
- Z. 13/16", 3/4", 9/16", 7/8" half inch sockets, half inch ratchet, with 3 and 6" extensions
- A-1 Brake adjustment tool.
- B-2 Medium size crescent wrench
- C-3 Extra water pump

All of these tools need not be the best you can buy and can be found at Harbor Freight. I would get a long handled torque wrench from Lowe's with a torque range of 50-150

If I have left off anything critical please let me know. If you have any questions on how and when to use these parts, I encourage you to come to the club's technical meetings where you can ask.

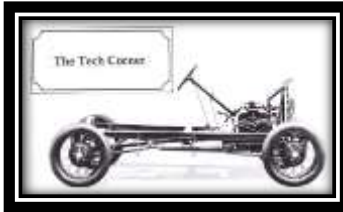

# The Tech Corner

## Gas Gauge Repair

There will come a time in the life of a surviving Model A when the gas gauge will need repair. The first order of business is to have the proper tools to get it apart. Model A suppliers carry them. Most repairs consist of replacing the float and the gaskets. The best choice for a float is one made of brass that modern fuels will not destroy. An excellent brass float is available from Reenlee H. Kotas of San Diego, 858-945-2018. Price in 2020 was \$6. Gaskets and brass slip rings can be obtained from Bratton's.

Gas gauge gaskets 13570 \$2.50 set  
 Brass slip rings 13571 \$1.15 each



The original Ford installation required only one brass slip ring. However, in the modern Model A kingdom it has been determined that at least two (or more) slip rings are required to prevent a fuel leak. With only one slip ring the outer nut will likely bottom on the threads before there is a crush on the gaskets. The drawing below shows two brass slip rings. It is also suggested that cork gaskets be used. Avoid the neoprene gaskets as modern fuels are likely to destroy them.

Our final installment of “A Backward Interest in Design” features the fun of decoration and jewelry to accentuate the allure of the low-backed gown. I really enjoyed the lovely photo of a modern Model A woman showing off her decorative brooch.

Photo on left shows a model from the 1928 *La Gazette du Bon Ton* which also appears in MAFCA's Fashion Files, p 68. The backdrop necklaces above appear in the annual illustrated catalog of Leonard Krower & Son's 1931.

Of course, bobbed hair and bared backs do provide nice landscapes for ladies to show off their jewelry. How often have we heard tales of our grandmothers or great grandmothers wearing their long necklaces backwards down their lovely backs. To illustrate a bit of *strass*, as Altman puts it, look to the 1931 illustration above left and to MAFCA member Tammie Jones below. Here the fashionable models wear rhinestone clips at their back décolleté. Then, too, capitalizing on the desire to accentuate the feminine back, manufacturers produced and sold “backdrop” necklaces especially for that purpose. Backdrop (sometimes spelled “back-drop”) necklaces, like traditional necklaces, decorate the neck-front and

fasten in the back; however, the “backdrop feature,” as seen in the figures above and the photo of Myrna Loy at the right, typically sport two or three strands that “drop” down below the coiffed hair-bun at the neck's nape and dangle between the shoulder blades. Model A Era fashions prove to be beautiful when women are both coming and going. The women of our era really knew how to make an exit!
