



Mileage: Round trip will be about 50 miles, mostly on Georgia and Coweta County secondary roads.


Destination: Chattahoochee Bend State Park, 425 Bob White Way, Newnan, GA


What to Bring: Your car, \$5 cash, and a box lunch and beverages for you and your passenger(s). We have reserved a picnic pavilion so we can lunch together.


Who: The \$5 cash is for the park pass and is per car. You may want to bring family or guests. It is a beautiful setting and you could probably use a cheering section.

MONASTERY of the HOLY SPIRIT TOUR:

Saturday, April 21, 2018

Kathy Huey put together a wonderful drive and tour on Saturday, April 21. Ten Model A's departed Peachtree City for a drive that took us east of Atlanta, to Conyers, site of the Monastery of the Holy Spirit, where we were met by additional Southside A members.




The church itself is a marvel of Gothic style, and is utilized several times a day for daily prayers. Some in our group took the opportunity to visit the church during one of these periods. But walking inside is awe inspiring at any time of day.

The Visitor's Center provides a wonderful film that tells the history as well as daily life of the monastery, with interviews with several of the monks. It gives you a sense of these men as real people, called to a particular way of life, separated in many ways, but still ordinary men living dedicated lives. The history of monasteries from the

7th century is also well displayed, featuring among many interesting things, the fact that many innovations in the areas of land reclamation, engineering, agriculture, technology, education and economics was the direct result of the Cistercian monks, followers of Benedict, following the call to simplicity and self-sufficiency.

Regardless of your religious persuasion, I highly recommend visiting this unique place in our own backyard; its richness of history, and many additional and surprising features, are well worth learning about, amid a beautiful and peaceful setting.

Our tour began with an introduction from one of the 28 monks residing at the monastery who gave us a brief history of this contemplative place that was established in 1944. Derived from an order of French Cistercians who founded the first "New World" abbey in Kentucky in 1851, this daughter abbey sits on what was at the time wilderness area in rural Georgia. Today the monks run an active bakery which turns out popular fudge and fruitcakes, and the art of bonsai is on display both in a preservation "outdoor museum" and by selling multiple varieties in their garden shop.

The Tech Corner

Maintaining the Model A Ford Radiator and Cooling System

Lots of people ask me about their radiators. There are several common problems that I thought we could address in this month's article. I will try to cover the basics, if you have any additional questions, call me anytime.

A Healthy cooling system: A well-maintained radiator and cooling system should be free of any leaks. The coolant temperature should remain within 100° of the temperature outside. In other words, on an 80° day the coolant temperature should stay under 180°. Measure with a temperature gage or laser thermometer at the upper water neck. Your coolant should never be a rusty color, and you should not have to add more than a quart of coolant during a normal drive. Keep in mind that a Model A cooling system is open to the outside atmosphere so you will lose coolant, you just shouldn't lose much.

Leaks: The most common leak is at the water pump. This can be corrected by rebuilding your water pump or replacing it with a "leakless" modern water pump. Another common leak is at the radiator cap. This will cause water to splash onto your windshield. This is not an overeating problem, just a problem with your cap sealing gasket. If you have a Quail or Moto-meter, you will have multiple gaskets, so you may have to spend some time making sure you have a good seal at the top of the radiator. If your radiator is leaking in the core, then a trip to the radiator shop or a new radiator may be in order. Of course hoses can also be a source of leaks. Just check everything carefully.

Rusty Coolant: Keep at least 1/2 gallon of anti-freeze in the car year round to prevent rust.

Flushing your cooling system: If you do have rusty water in your cooling system, you can try flushing it out with a garden hose. Make sure your engine is cool, then remove the upper radiator hose. Place a garden hose and the top of your radiator and turn on the water at a medium rate. Allow your engine to idle, letting the freshwater flush down to your radiator and up through your engine and out onto your clean driveway. The rusty stains will remain there for years. There are also some excellent chemical flushing agents available at your local auto parts store which will really clean the system well. Just follow the directions on the container.

More advanced problems: you can have more advanced problems such as a leak at your head gasket. If water disappears from your cooling system at an alarming rate or if you get water contamination in your oil then you can pressure test your cooling system to find hidden leaks. These pressure test kits are available at auto parts stores, sometimes they will even loan you the kit free of charge. Keep in mind you will need to plug off the overflow pipe before you can pressure test.



Still having problems? If you had checked everything above and still have overheating problems then I would recommend a new radiator such as a Brassworks. Your original radiator is almost 90 years old, and they do wear out. Let me know if we can help.

MARC Membership Meet


