





We're just getting started on an exciting touring season, so come on out and enjoy your car.





14TH ANNUAL SENOIA MEMORIAL DAY PARADE MONDAY, MAY 27, 2019

THE PARADE "CHECK IN" LOCATION IS ON PYLANT ST. (LOOK FOR SIGNS AND TABLE). YOU WILL ENTER OFF HWY 16 TO PYLANT ST. BY THE LIBRARY/LAKE. LOOK FOR A PATROL CAR. WE WILL HAVE VOLUNTEERS WHO WILL GIVE YOU A NUMBER, AND YOU WILL PROCEED TO THAT PRE-MARKED SPACE. TOTAL LENGTH OF ENTRY IS VERY IMPORTANT!

Chattanooga Directors' Tour re-cap



Our Spring Directors' Tour is in the record book, and it was a great success. We had close to 30 people, including 12 Model A's. The weather cooperated nicely, and our time together was terrific.

We had a caravan that began with four cars leaving out of the Palmetto area, and were joined at various points along the way

by another five. The group was rounded out once we reached our hotel, and a happy band we were. Our hotel turned out to be perfectly suited to accommodate trailers, special parking for the A's, and an inviting gathering area for visiting, breakfast, etc.

But I'm getting ahead of myself....




We stopped in the town of Chickamauga for a pizza lunch at Pie Slingers, before heading on to the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park. Driving towards the Visitor's Center you pass monuments on both sides of the road, and even into the woods, marking the various fighting units that took part in the battle of Chickamauga in September, 1863. We saw an informative film, multiple displays, and had the opportunity to drive through many of the locations of the battle; a sobering exercise, to be sure. One could easily spend half a day to more fully take in the vastness of the event.

Arriving at the hotel we were met by more of our fellow tourers, got checked in and freshened up before driving down along the Tennessee River to enjoy dinner at The Boathouse Restaurant. It was located in an area we would pass several times as we explored the city.

Friday was a free day, and everyone took in various sites, which often involved ice cream and other delicacies, followed by a turn on the beautiful carousel.



This was the prelude to our evening cruise on the Southern Belle, as we floated down the river as far as the Chickamauga Dam and back. The buffet dinner was very nice, as were all the folks working on the boat to give us a delightful evening. The musical duo handling guitar, keyboard, harmonica and vocals were very accomplished and kept us well entertained the whole evening. We even had some impressive singing along (and lip syncing) to old favorites. With a tour to the other decks, watching the river flow by with the wind in our hair, and the chance to hang out in the pilot's cabin, it was a relaxing and cheery evening.



Saturday we were off to Ducktown (the name is a translation of the Cherokee word "kawana"), the site of copper mining from the mid-1800s until 1987. Located near the Ocoee River, we stopped along the way to look at one leg of the rapids, which was also the site of the kayaking competition of the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

One of the results of the mining operation was the denuding of all trees and other vegetation from a large area of the hills; several of the people in our



group had vivid memories of driving through this area as youngsters and being awed by the moonscape atmosphere. Thankfully, reforestation efforts have taken hold and the hills are green once again.






