



### THE GAS AND GLASS TOUR! NOVEMBER 21, 2020



Greg Marshall has put together a fun and varied tour for us that will take place on Saturday, November 21. We will begin with a visit to the car collection of Thornton Chevrolet owner, John Thornton. At the home property graced by woods and a lake, a light breakfast will be served in the warehouse that holds a number of cars with interesting and unique histories. Mr. Thornton will be with us, and he and Greg can share the details of the collection as well as the history of the Thornton family business ventures in the Douglasville area of greater Atlanta.

Next we'll head east toward Smyrna, travelling mostly backroads, including a drive through the Concord Covered Bridge that spans the Nickajack River and dates from the mid-1800's. In 1980 it was added to the National Register of Historic Places.

This will take us to the glassblowing studio of Don, Thom and "Peanut" Lillie (father, son and granddaughter), where we'll get to learn about some of the techniques for making glass objects, such as sculptures, awards, scientific glass products, and more. The senior Mr. Lillie, 92 years old, began glassblowing at the Mayo Clinic, producing scientific instruments, then attended Georgia Tech where he graduated with a degree in Physics and stayed on as master glassblower in chemistry until he retired in 1985. Lillie Glassblowers began after that. Don also owns a Model A! And will hopefully bring along for us to see.

Our last stop will be a short distance away at Jim N'Nicks BBQ Restaurant for lunch. There is plenty of room for social distancing, including a separate room for our group, as well as patio seating, if desired.

Gwyneth & Mike Shotwell will lead the drive to our first stop, where Greg will take over as our guide for the tour. Then they will lead the group back to the Palmetto area.



Report from Tech Guru, Tom Romine, describing work done to Larry Peterson's Roadster:

We removed all of the old wiring from the car. Installed a new wiring harness with turn signal wiring included. Rewired both head lights, both cowl lights and

both tail lights. Rewired the turn signals and installed a ground cable to the transmission case. Larry drove her home, and said it ran strong.



#### WINDOW REGULATOR SPRING TOOL

Sometimes a window regulator spring will either break or become so weak that it makes it hard to roll up the window. Installing a new spring can be difficult and also dangerous.

Take an old distributor shaft and weld on a T handle made from rod stock. Grind down the slotted end so the slot is only 1/4" deep. Put the regulator in a vise and wind it until the lift arm is all the way up. This is the position in which the spring is least compressed. Hook the outer




hook of the spring and insert the tool in the center. Turn the tool to compress the spring until it fits into the slot. Release the tool. Tap the spring into position with a hammer.






## 2021 National Meet Date


