We will visit the notable Pebble Hill Plantation which was one of the "shooting plantations" providing winter recreation. The grounds are beautiful and extensive, and we will have a picnic lunch after touring the main house and the upstairs art gallery. The gardens and outbuildings are self-guided and well worth your time.

We will also enjoy lunch at the famous Mr. Chick in nearby Cairo, followed by a tour of the owners' truly spectacular private car and memorabilia collection, located behind the restaurant.

Thomasville is a lovely walk-able, charming town featuring shopping, antiquing and a variety of eating (and ice cream!) offerings. You will have free time to explore and relax around our planned activities.

# The Tech Corner

#### **IDLING**

If you just can't seem to make your Model A idle properly (ta-puck-a-ta, puck-a-ta, puck-a-ta) like they are famous for, check the following:

- l'. Are your valves in good condition? No burned exhausts valves Compression good?
- 2. Is the carburetor okay? Has it been checked out?
- 3. Is the distributor okay? New condenser, etc.?
- 4. No excess play in the distributor linkage?
- 5. Do you have Champion 3X spark plugs? Are they fairly new plugs?
- 6. Is the spark plug gap 0.035" to 0.040"?
- Look for possible leaks in the intake system like manifold gaskets, cracked intake manifold, faulty windshield wiper hose or fittings.
- 8. Check for manifold leaks by spraying a very light liquid like WD-40 along the manifold to block gasket while the engine is idling. Does it slow down? If it does your manifold gaskets might be leaking. The gaskets could be improperly installed or the manifold surfaces could be warped.



#### Our fabulous time on the Dick & Jane tour.....

The Dick & Jane Tour has come to be known for highlighting the history of Georgia and this year did not disappoint. Participants came from all over, including Tennessee and Mississippi. Dick Carne led a contingent from Flash Foods on a beautiful drive, with our first destination being the **Zion Episcopal** 

**Church** in Talbotton, near Columbus, that was built in 1848. This lovely building is a finalist in an historic grant program, needing crucial repairs to its bell tower. Our hosts gave us information about this, and we were able to cast our votes for the project online. We were also treated to refreshments.




Zion Episcopal Church



After lunch in Columbus we went to the fabulous National Civil War Naval Museum where we had tours from knowledgeable costumed docents. It was fascinating to learn what an important role Columbus played in the outfitting of ships during the Civil War. The collection of flags from that period is one of the best and most important in the country.

Car lift at old Ford dealership.



Our numbers swelled as other folks came from different directions to see the church, and then go about a block away to visit the Ford-**Battle Building**. It was originally a Ford Agency, and when the original owner

died in 1827 his wife to over the business, becoming the first woman in the country to run a Ford dealership.

The original lift is still in place, which took cars to the second floor for service, and is still in working order. A Model A on the lift added to the historic effect.



Friday evening found us at our hotel, the Columbus Marriott, in a brick building that once housed a grist mill. Train tracks run along one of the streets, with a couple of journeys during the night and early morning, adding to the historic feel.

The **Sherlock Holmes Dinner Theatre** at the hotel served up a nice meal along with a terrific, entertaining murder mystery, complete with audience participation. Several of our group took part, exercising their acting chops and adding to the hilarity of the evening. Walt Smith, Pat Tyler, Steve Rinaldo, Gwyneth Shotwell, Marilyn Corley and Anne Carter did us proud in furthering the mystery story line. A final surprise was the awarding of the "Academy Award" to Gwyneth Shotwell's portrayal of Mark Zuckerberg (talent, eh?).







Boot Shop – Historic Westville

Saturday we went to **Historic**Westville just outside of town.

When last we visited Westville it was located in Lumpkin,

Georgia. The new location just opened in June after moving 17 structures, preparing new foundations, repairing brick

chimneys, and setting up a wonderful 19<sup>th</sup> century west Georgia town. Several buildings had costumed guides who were very knowledgeable,

demonstrating everything from leather work to woodworking to quilt making, and more. It is well worth a trip to see.



After a Chick-fil-a lunch under the trees we ventured the short distance to the **National Infantry Museum** at Fort Benning. What an impressive and amazing museum! Dedicated to the infantry, the "last 100 yards" of military operations, the exhibits take you on a close-up journey from the Revolutionary War through 21<sup>st</sup> century desert warfare. It is a moving and sobering experience that has to give every visitor a renewed sense of gratitude for our armed forces. One visit is not nearly enough time to fully appreciate all the displays; we will definitely plan to return.

Saturday night we had a nice farewell dinner at **Broadway Barbeque** in downtown Columbus. The building is the old bus station, originally built in the 1930s, and still retains a bus turned into a dining room. It's perfect for youngsters since you can sit in the driver's seat and take in all the controls.

So, another Dick & Jane tour is in the books and it was simply wonderful. Thanks to Liz Horne for her splendid efforts in securing all the venues, and Dick Carne for further coordination and driving/leading duties. These things, and many more that go on behind the scenes, made this a smooth, enjoyable adventure.
