

Most of the Model A get togethers for the year have been cancelled and it has left a void in our lives as we have gotten to know such great people in the hobby. Model A Day at the Gilmore was also cancelled to protect the health of all Model A Hobbyists. Our theme for this years event was First Responders which is very appropriate with what is happening right now and this theme will cappy over to next years event.


We all converged on the delightful Cupboard Café, with friendly greetings all round, and a nice lunch as well. Then we headed up the mountain road towards Highlands and Franklin, for our first waterfall stop. But wait! Only part way up the curvy road the Romines had to pull over with car trouble. As the rest of us pulled into a nearby scenic stop, Tom determined the mechanical problem and made the call to be towed back to the hotel.



So, on to our first stop – Bridal Veil Falls, right off the road. We pulled off and were impressed with the force of water cascading over the cliffs above, coming down right next to us. The sound of rushing water was truly exhilarating.



Driving further along the woodsy, windy road, we came to Dry Falls. The name, no doubt occasionally accurate, was a misnomer that afternoon. That rushing water sound was multiplied several times from this magnificent display of Nature's power. There was an elevated walkway from which you could look down into the gorge and see the falls, but for the up-close experience there were stairs and walkways down through the woods to the falls themselves. One of the major features is the ability to walk behind that rushing curtain of water; a thrilling experience. And the scene presented some fun and unusual photo opportunities:

Saturday dawned with cloudy skies and we enjoyed periods of rain now and then. But the touring was lovely, starting with a drive through the charming campus of Young Harris College that took us to a quaint park and the Cupid Falls. Then (after a push or two for starters) we made our way through the mountains to visit Dick's Creek, located in Cleveland; an impressive waterfall feeding a wide creek amongst rugged forest.

Hardman Farms was our next venue, where we had lunch and toured the historic home on the grounds. The tree-lined path to the home is what remains of an 18<sup>th</sup> century road, the famous Unicoi Turnpike,



once used by both Indian and European trappers to take their wares to the Savannah River and on to markets across the Atlantic. The home was built in 1870 and had three different occupants over the years, the last being Mr. Hardman and his family. Sinks with running water in each bedroom, early lighting with acetylene gas, and a cupola that allowed the escape of hot air in the summers, were a few of the "modern" conveniences introduced by the owners.



The last stop on Saturday was to Clarksville, Georgia, to see the Miles Through Time Auto Museum, which was also hosting a cruise-in, offering a variety of cars to enjoy, while also letting other guests admire our Model A's.




## The Tech Corner

# Jim's Tech Tip



Bending the Radiator Overflow Tube Back

The Ford Service Bulletins of April, 1930 (page 450) advise that if you have excessive coolant loss though the radiator overflow tube, you can bent the tube back toward the back edge of the radiator filler neck. They also mention soldering in a brass washer where the tube passes through the baffle plate.





To bend the tube, insert a larger Phillips screwdriver into the tube. You want the smooth shaft of the screwdriver to pretty much fill the tube, and don't have the tip of the screwdriver go below the baffle plate, about 2 to 3 inches. Then gently push the screwdriver back away from you a bit, remove the screwdriver a bit (~½"), then bend it some more. Repeat until the top of the tube is as far "back" as it will go.

If you need to, you can add a short piece of rubber tubing to the top of the overflow tube to raise the level in the top tank that much more before the coolant starts going out the overflow. But don't raise it too much or coolant will start leaking out of your radiator cap and make a mess on your paint and radiator shell.

I hope this helps. Have a Model A Day! Jim






