

The Shotwells will be leading the tour from Sam's Club on Fischer Road.




Highlights from the Mar. 28, 2015 Board Meeting

FASHION FINDS ... By Gwyneth Shotwell



Modern Priscilla, October, 1929

I discovered something rather fascinating while looking through this issue of *Modern Priscilla*: a piece on "Semi-Made" dresses. The illustrations at the left were lovely depictions of sewing patterns one could buy, which included many parts of the ensemble already completed. The idea was that you would purchase the pattern, with the finished parts, and then simply put them together with your sewing machine.

For example, the frock on the right was described like this: "The business girl, who has little time to sew, the college girl and the homemaker all have constant need for something simple, smart and efficient looking. What could be more so than a two-piece frock of printed tween flat crepe which has its blouse front all finished, collar and cuffs and pockets all made, skirt pleats all laid and bodice material included."

It went on to describe the sizes available and the different fabrics – "...tweed print on a brown, Ensign blue or black background."

In doing a brief bit of research online I found that there were actually a pair of companies that advertised this same type of product, Berth Robert, and Fifth Avenue Modes. They both offered catalogs to shop from, and advertised that they provide everything you need to do the simplest of sewing to complete your outfit, including a spool of matching thread. Since both of these companies continued well into the 1930's it's evident that it was an idea

that had a significant market. And since sewing for yourself was much more common at that time, most women would have the capabilities to put the outfit together, while preserving more time as lives were always getting busier. Definitely a fun "Fashion Find."



The Tech Corner

Model A Q&A's

From Ben Bohanan

Q: The other evening I drove my 1929 Fordor. I didn't realize when I got home that I left my parking lights on. The next morning my battery was flat dead. I charged it up, but now it keeps blowing the fuse. It never blew the fuse before, what went wrong?

A: Believe it or not, you may have accidentally charged the battery backwards. In other words, the polarity of the battery is now reversed. The Model A uses a positive ground electrical system. If you charge the battery with the black lead of the battery charger going to ground, then the battery will take a charge in reverse. You can check this with a voltmeter. If that is the problem you will need to leave the lights on and run the battery dead again, then charge it correctly. Let me know if this solves your problem.


Q: I have a 1930 Tudor. The paint and interior looks nice, but the top is looking ratty, and leaks when I drive it in the rain. How much trouble is it to replace the top material?


A: This is a great project if you are handy and a DIY kind of person. You can get a complete kit from Mike's "A" Fordable Parts to do the job. Instructions are included. One thing I must caution you on is if your top has already been leaking, then chances are the wood underneath will be rotten. You can check this with a sharp instrument like an ice pick. The wood should be solid and stable enough to hold nails. Changing out the wood is a bigger project than the top, but many times you will have to do both.


Q: My 1931 Coupe has been in our family since the 1950s. It underwent a full restoration back in the 80s, and we have really enjoyed it since. Often, though, when I drive it water from the radiator sprays out on the hood and windshield. Could this be an overheating problem?

A: Often this is not so much overheating as it is just a faulty seal under the radiator cap. If you have a Quail or Moto meter, check the rubber seal between the cap and the radiator neck. You can even use some silicon sealer in this area, if needed.
