**First Tech Meet of the Year!
Another success....**



Our tech Meet was about getting a car ready for the Touring Season.

We wound up with two cars for this meet. Kelly Adams, brought her '29 Roadster and Steve Vied brought his '30 Sedan.

We discussed what needed to be looked at on our cars to keep them running and stopping on a tour. Brakes, the number one item. Must be able to stop the car. Who cares about the car running if you cannot stop your car. Then we discussed lubrication, engine oil, transmission gear oil, Rear axle gear oil, normal overall grease from the front spring all the way to the

rear spring (everything in between).

Discussed the engine oil types and brands. The gear oil types and then Engine coolant. Sent out a separate email on the types of Anti-freeze and what we should use in or A's and why.

We put Kelly's Roadster on the lift and discussed further while Steve and Kelly greased the car and we checked the gear oil in the transmission and rear axle. Also checked the steering gear oil. Her car is in great shape as it was restored just several years ago, but had not been on a Tour. She now has confidence her car can make a Tour with us.

Then we had lunch with Hot Dogs, potato salad, baked beans, chips and desert.

After lunch we worked on Steve Vied's sedan. His car was not running just right so I adjusted the points, the timing and adjusted the carburetor. He said it sounded better and ran better.




Cost is \$8/per person.

ATLANTA HISTORY CENTER TOUR – Recap

Saturday, March 25, 2023

An early morning storm gave way to blue skies and sunshine on Saturday, March 25; a perfect day to visit the spectacular Atlanta History Museum, located down the street from the Georgia Governor’s mansion, in a lovely neighborhood.


Our group of about 18 came from the Southside A’s, the Goldmine Region, as well as the Georgia Region. We began our visit with Civil War-related exhibits. The beautifully restored locomotive, the Texas, is on display, and the story of its role in the race to capture the General is as exciting as any action movie; in fact, Disney did make a movie of it, starring Fess Parker! Right nearby was an incredible (and huge) screen showing graphically what took place during the Battle of Atlanta. It is worth the visit, all by itself. And that gave us an introduction to seeing the historic and fully restored **Cyclorama** painting, “The Battle of Atlanta.” The graphics, once again, are impressive and make the depiction of the battle come alive.

Then we took the scenic walk to the **Swan House**, home to the Inman family and designed by architect Phillip Tramell Shutze in 1928. This is a grand, yet inviting home. In addition, the decorative arts collection of Mr. Shutze, housed on the Terrace Level of the house, is a feast for the eyes, as well as a glimpse into the career of a talented classical architect.

Lunch at Souper Jenny’s completed our visit, with tasty food, and fun conversation about other touring opportunities...Model A-ers always on the go!





FASHION FINDS...

Continuing our fun survey of the year 1931 in Model A fashions, here is page 2 the article from Jill Barrett, Santa Clara Valley Chapter of MAFCA.



Felt and straw cloches had close fitting brims with shallow cap-like crowns for daytime wear. For afternoon wear, straw and horse hair hats tended to have larger brims. In general, hats were worn up off the face, pulled down on one side to expose a woman's graceful waves of hair. Her hat was matched with her accessories instead of her dress or coat as in previous years. Fur scarves were still popular and a sign of discriminating taste. Shawls and scarves were practical and available during all years. Colored stone jewelry was almost entirely relegated to sport and morning outings. Pearls are seen more with fluttering afternoon frocks and colored crystals

were popular for afternoons and evenings.

Purses were still a major accessory, usually made from leather, but fabric purses were also found with needlework or petit point. Late afternoon and evening bags were smaller than daytime bags. Course mesh, fine mesh and enameled mesh were popular with art deco designs and shapes. Glass beaded purses with colorful designs were popular for evening outings.



Seamed hose and shoe styles did not change in 1931. Shoes with round, square and pointed toes were common throughout 1931. The heel height was determined by the purpose of the shoe. Evening shoes had graceful, slender heels.

The new lines were nothing if they weren't slenderizing. Women were encouraged to select dresses with small prints, soft flattering collars and surplice closings. The sophisticated, elegant look and fashions of 1931 were meant to uplift women and help them forget the bleak years and the shapeless day wear when the stock market crashed.
