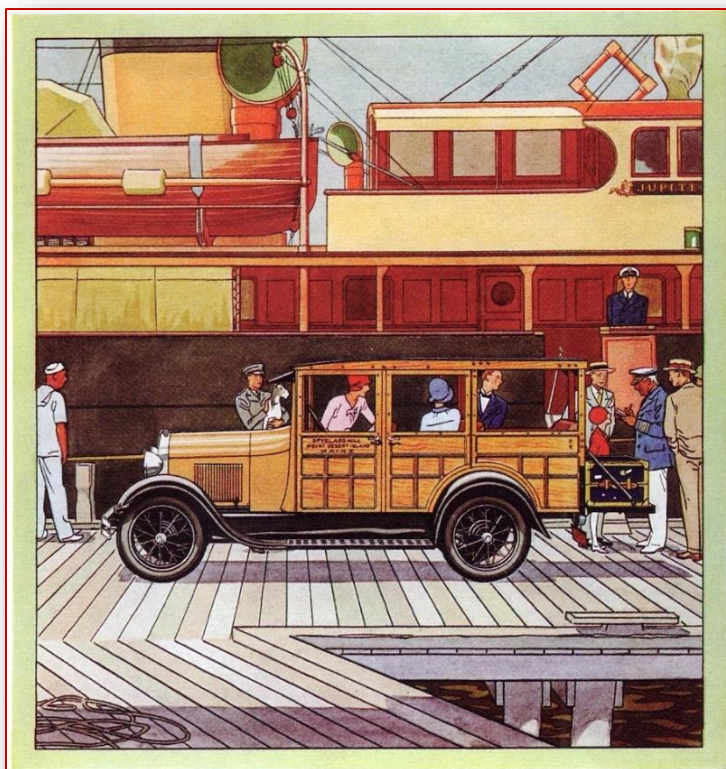

## AUGUST 6, 2016 – ANNUAL “MOONLIGHT TOUR”



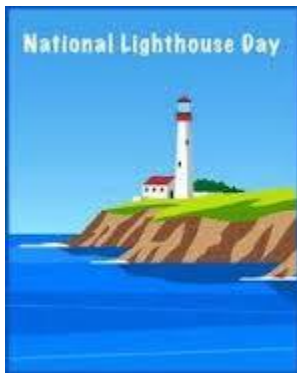
Plans are set for our trip to Milner, GA, and a fantastic Southern buffet at Tim's Lighthouse.

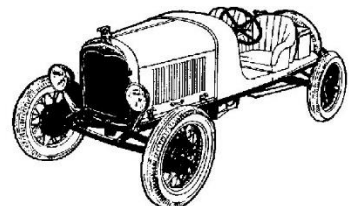
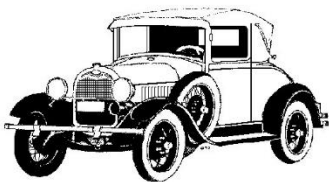
### August 7 is National Lighthouse Day!

# Stately Oaks Tour

On Saturday, July 9, an intrepid group of Southside A-ers defied the moist and toasty atmosphere to enjoy a half-day of local history. Jason and Tina Carne arranged for us to tour the plantation home of Stately Oaks in historic Jonesboro, complete with authentically costumed docents to lead the way.



The Shotwells began the morning breakfasting at the Broadway Diner in Fayetteville, joined by Tom & Liz Romine in their lovely Victoria. Although the Romine's did not attend the tour, we sure enjoyed having them take us up on our early-bird start to the day!

We met up at the government center up the road with several other members of the club in their Model As and followed our leader, Dick Carne for the drive to Jonesboro. We were met there by Jason and Tina and their little charge, Gary, who is rapidly becoming a Model A enthusiast...just look at him honk the ahooga horn!



We learned that Stately Oaks was built in 1839, four miles from its present location. The Ford Motor Company having purchased the land on which the home stood in the 1970s, offered to pay to have it relocated. So the house was sawed in half, moved on two flatbed trucks, and put back together where it stands today. It has been impressively furnished with a full array of period artifacts that provides the visitor with a real feeling that they have stepped back in time.

The grounds have several period buildings, including a fun general store, as well as the remains of a chimney from the home of Margaret Mitchell's great-grandfather, who owned a large plantation south of Jonesboro. *Gone with the Wind* was set in Clayton County and Margaret grew up visiting relatives there and hearing all kinds of stories which planted the seeds for her epic novel.

Lunch at a friendly bistro nearby rounded out our adventure, and we parted company to head for the comfort of modern day air conditioning. And, as they say, a good time was had by all!

## Cooling tips for summer weather:

### Bentley Bohanan

Guys call the shop daily to ask questions and catch us up on their Model A projects. Of course, when the temperatures get close to 100° lots of thoughts turn towards the cooling systems. Here are some tips.

**Fans.** There are several choices available. First is the original 2-blade steel fan. These are now over 85 years old and prone to crack and throw a blade. These must be inspected often for cracks. They are almost always cracked at the leading edge of the blade near the nut. Next up is the replacement aluminum two-blade fan. These are excellent replacements, and we have used hundreds of them. Your next choice is a steel four-blade fan. These are also good replacements but I have read where they actually pull a little more power from the engine to move the same amount of air. If you don't mind the non-original look I have heard that the modern six-blade fan is the most efficient and an excellent replacement for a touring engine. Whatever your choice, be sure and install properly.



**Fan Belt.** Check your Fan Belt often for cracks or wear. Stay away from "Cogged" belts, they will be noisy. You will think the noise is your alternator or generator, no it's the cogged belt.

**Water Pump.** Not much to go wrong here. If your water pump is leaking, you can either rebuild it yourself or by a new one. Either way, be sure to get a modern seal, and don't mess with the original style packing. I've seen water pumps with bad impellers, but this is rare.

**Coolant.** I recommend mixing at least a half-gallon of anti-freeze/coolant with the water in your radiator. This will keep the water from becoming rusty inside your engine. If rusty water ends up on your paint or under the hood, it will stain. It is worth some coolant to prevent this.

**Temperature Gauge.** This is a great idea. Although not original, it is good peace of mind to know what's going on under the hood. Ideal running temperature will be less than 100° above the ambient outside temperature.

Good luck with your cooling system this summer!

## Week-end Overview

### Rome, Georgia

The first people to live in Northwest Georgia were the Cherokee Indians, who were a peaceful tribe. One of their leaders was Major Ridge, who was a wealthy trader and the owner of a ferry that crossed the Oostanaula River near his home, "Chieftains."

The discovery of gold in Dahlonega in 1828 brought people from the coast eager to search for gold. Gold meant the end of the peaceful life led by the Cherokees in this area. In 1838, the Trail of Tears led fourteen thousand Cherokees to their new home in the West.

Five men founded Rome in 1834. Their idea was to build a town that would become a trade center using riverboats as transportation.

The next year Rome received its charter and the county seat was moved from Livingston to Rome. Rome soon became the main river port between Gadsden, Alabama and Calhoun, Georgia. Boats as large as one hundred and seventy-five feet in length brought cargo, mail and passengers into Rome. In 1839, the Rome Railroad was chartered. By 1860, Rome had a bank, a newspaper, a college, churches, and was a busy hub of trade.

During the Civil War, Rome was a medical center and wounded from both sides were brought into Rome for treatment. Hospitals were set up in churches and many of the buildings on Broad Street. In May of 1864, Rome fell to the Union Forces under the command of General William T. Sherman. Soldiers of the Union Army occupied Rome until November of that year. When General Sherman and his men departed they set fire to many of the buildings. Those he spared were being used as hospitals.

Rome was rebuilt from the ashes. It is now the medical center of Northwest Georgia. The three rivers, which first attracted the founders, now provide a source of water for drinking, manufacturing, and recreation. Bridges which had been built across the three rivers made growth easier and the small towns which had grown up across the rivers were annexed into Rome by the early part of the 20th Century. The 1900 Census was 7,291 and in 1910 following the annexation, the population had risen to 12,099.

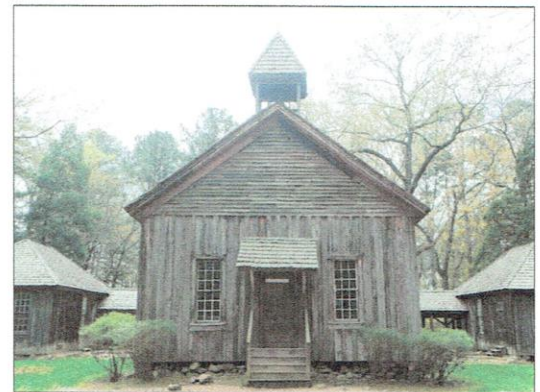
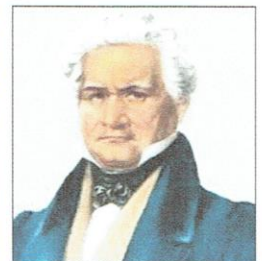
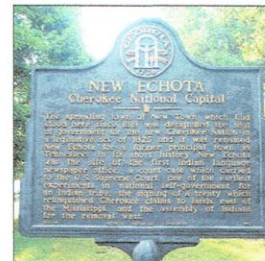
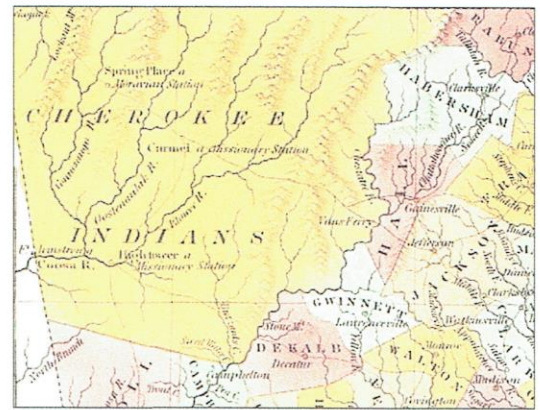
### FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 2ND

### 2:00 PM - Oak Hill & The Martha Berry Museum

A magnificent example of Greek revival architecture, Oak Hill was the home of Berry College founder Martha Berry. Today, it is preserved as it was when she lived there. Guests also may tour Aunt Martha's Cottage, restored home of Martha Freeman, Miss Berry's beloved cook; and the Oak Hill Carriage House, which displays vintage vehicles such as Miss Berry's buggy, two Model-T Fords, a 1940 Mercury and a Fordson tractor.

The Martha Berry Museum, located on the grounds of Oak Hill, serves as the reception center for visitors. It houses a remarkable collection of art and Berry memorabilia. Berry College students serve as guides.

**10:00 AM - Depart for Major Ridge Home and Chieftains Museum**  
Chieftains Museum, also known as the Major Ridge Home, was built around a log house of 1792 in Cherokee country. It was the home of the Cherokee leader Major Ridge— notable for his role in negotiating and signing the Treaty of New Echota of 1835, which ceded the remainder of Cherokee lands in the Southeast to the United States. He was part of a minority group known as the Treaty Party, who believed that relocation was inevitable and wanted to negotiate the best deal with the United States for their people. The chiefs had agreed they could not go to war against the United States on the removal issue, but most other Cherokee opposed Ridge and the Treaty Party. He and some other members of the Treaty Party were assassinated after removal to the Cherokee Nation in Indian Territory for having ceded the tribe's communal lands, as this was considered a capital crime.

New Echota is one of the most significant Cherokee Indian sites in the nation and was where the tragic "Trail of Tears" officially began. In 1825, the Cherokee national legislature established a capital called New Echota at the headwaters of the Oostanaula River. During its short history, New Echota was the site of the first Indian language newspaper office, a court case which carried to the U.S. Supreme Court, one of the earliest experiments in national self government by an Indian tribe, the signing of a treaty which relinquished Cherokee claims to lands east of the Mississippi River, and the assembly of Indians for removal west on the infamous Trail of Tears.

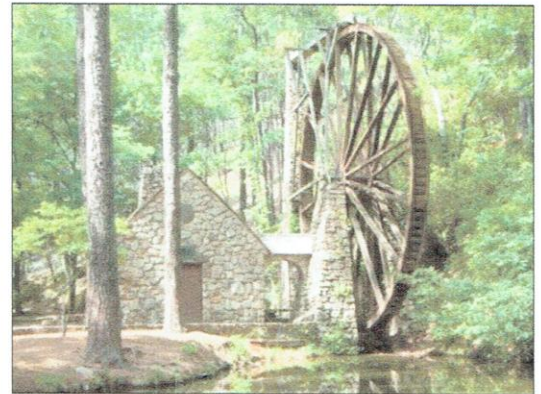

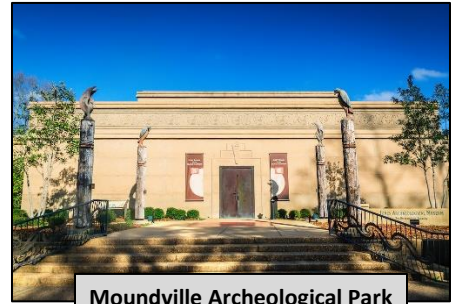
## You are invited to the Tenth Annual Sweet Home Alabama Tour

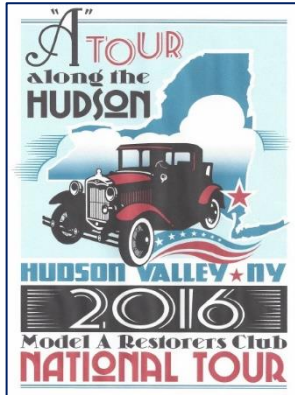
