



Jim Hunter, the Director of the [Southside A's Model A Club](#) says what makes the Model A so special is their age.



"They're so unique. They were made from 1928 to 1931, but you don't see many on the road anymore," Hunter said.

Historic Windsor Hotel

This year's tour will be based out of **Americus, GA**, and our host hotel will be the historic **Windsor Hotel**, built c. 1892.

Highlights will include visits to the beautiful **Rylander Theater**, just a block from our hotel. Opening in January of 1921, the theater boasted a \$5,000 pipe organ, a "typhoon cooling and ventilating fan system," and nearly 1,000 opera chairs; a captivating venue.

We will also tour the **Drummer Boy Civil War Museum** in Andersonville, which houses a very special collection of artifacts from the Confederacy, including many identified to specific soldiers. From there we will tour the Confederacy's **Andersonville Prison Camp**, a sobering yet important local chapter of the Civil War.

The **Rural Telephone Museum** will be our next destination that is also home to a number of antique and other automobiles, along with other historical exhibits. It's a truly unique and fun place to experience.

Dinner Friday night will be at the **Carnegie Library**, now owned by The Canterbury Kitchen, who will be providing us with a buffet dinner.

Saturday will find us heading to the Veterans State Park Depot in Cordele for an all-day excursion on the **SAM Shortline Railroad**. There will be a short “lunch stop” back again in Americus, and from there the train will proceed south across Lake Blackshear to Plains for another short stop before our return to Cordele. The train and its air-conditioned passenger cars are of a 1949 vintage.

Unfortunately we are only able to get confirmed seating on the SAM Rail Line if we send funds in a minimum of thirty (30) days before the event. Consequently we have had to move the **Registration cutoff** to **August 5th, 2022**.

HOTEL RESERVATIONS: We have reserved an initial block of twenty (20) rooms with room rates of between \$110 and \$120 per night (exclusive of taxes) depending upon the size and number of beds per room. 



The Tech Corner

Jim's Tech Tips "Mounting Wheels"

I know that my Dad reads these Tech Tips, so today's is a special shout out to him, who taught me this Tip for mounting wheels when I was about 12 years old. Thanks, Dad!

Start with a classic X-style lug nut wrench. If you don't already have one, mine is 20" across and works quite well.

Place the wheel/tire next to the vehicle, leaning it against the hub and brake drum you plan to mount it on. Adjust the jack so that the wheel needs to be lifted an inch or two onto the studs.



Now slip two of the tire iron arms under the tire, one arm to the left of where the tire touches the ground, and the other arm to the right. Grab one of the tire iron arms that is pointing out toward you, and lift the tire up with one hand while you guide the wheel to hang on a stud or two with the other hand.



Hold the wheel in against the drum while you lower the lug wrench and use that free hand to start a lug nut on one of the studs. Once you have that lug nut started, you can let go of the wheel and start the rest of them. Use the tire iron to run them all in snug, then lower the jack and tighten them all again.

This Tip is not just applicable to mounting a wheel/tire on a Model A. It works on pretty much any vehicle: car, truck, trailer... In fact, the larger and heavier the wheel/tire is that you are putting on, the bigger help this is.

So in the shop or out on the road, use a simple tire iron to help you lift a wheel up into place and hold it there while you start the lug nuts.

FASHION FINDS...

This month we continue the article about zippers, otherwise known as Slide Fasteners. Thanks to the MAFCA website for featuring this article by Perry Wood of the Piney Wood Model A Club in Northwest Houston, Texas.

Slide Fasteners

In the 1930s, a sales campaign began for children's clothing featuring zippers. The campaign advocated zippers as a way to promote self-reliance in young children as the devices made it possible for them to dress in self-help clothing.

The Battle of the Fly:

A landmark moment happened in 1937 when the zipper beat the button in the "Battle of the Fly." French fashion designers raved over the use of zippers in men's trousers and Esquire magazine declared the zipper the "Newest Tailoring Idea for Men."



Zippers in the Model A Era:

Within the MAFCA Fashion Guidelines, there are six mentions of slide fasteners or zippers. "Slide fasteners or zippers, were discussed in men's tailors' magazines, but were not commonly used in the fly until after the Model A era. They could be found in pockets or down the front of coveralls (as seen on page one)."



"To the left, a heavy washable cotton suede cloth that looks like fine suede leather and wears almost as well. This three-piece set, with sliding rustproof fastener, is practical for boys and girls."

Additionally they were found in both men's and women's golf bags for the ball and shoe compartments.


