

Thoughts from Our Director

I thought this month I would give you something a little different in the way of a director's letter. Here's an interesting story about Amelia Earhart and her experience with her Model A Ford.

In 1928, Amelia Earhart, an American aviator and author, embarked on a unique adventure in her new Model A Ford. She and her friend, Louise Thaden, participated in the first Women's Air Derby, also known as the Powder Puff Derby, a transcontinental air race from Santa Monica, California to Cleveland, Ohio.

However, before the race began, Earhart and Thaden had to drive their Model A Ford from Los Angeles to Santa Monica, a distance of about 20 miles, to register for the race. The two women decided to make the journey in style, and they decorated their car with decals and slogans promoting the race.

The journey was not without its challenges. The roads were rough and unpaved, and the car had to navigate through busy city streets and winding mountain roads. However, Earhart and Thaden were determined to make it to the starting line in time, and they arrived to cheers and applause from the other racers and spectators.

The Women's Air Derby was a grueling test of endurance and skill, with 20 women pilots competing over a distance of 2,759 miles. Earhart and Thaden, both experienced pilots, were among the favorites to win the race.



The Tech Corner


The Ahooguh Origin

The ahooguh horn, also known as a Klaxon horn was developed and patented by Miller Reese Hutchison, an inventor of the early 20th century. Hutch, as he was known, patented the mechanism in 1908. The Lovell-McConnell Manufacturing Company of Newark, New Jersey bought the rights to manufacture the device and it later became standard equipment on motor cars. Franklyn Hallett Lovell Jr., the company founder, coined the name *klaxon* from the Ancient Greek verb *klazō*, meaning shriek. Klaxon horns produce an easily identifiable sound, often described in English as "ahooguh". Like most mechanical horns, the klaxon has largely been replaced by solid-state electronic devices, though the memorable tone has persisted on in classic cars of the era. Klaxon later became a brand name. The Klaxon horn was used on U.S. submarines during WWII. The Klaxon horn's characteristic sound is produced by a spring-steel diaphragm with a rivet in the center that is repeatedly struck by the teeth of a rotating cogwheel. The diaphragm is attached to a horn that acts as an acoustic transformer and controls the direction of the sound. In the first Klaxons, the wheel was driven either by hand or by an electric motor. Hutchison went to work for Thomas Edison in 1909, and was the chief engineer for Edison from 1912 to 1918. The ahooguh sound is usually heard today when a Model A Ford goes rolling down the road.



FASHION FINDS...

Here is page 2 of our story on jabots and Bertha collars from Laurie Elliott of the Santa Clara Valley Chapter, courtesy of the MAFCA website.

Below left is a dress from the Montgomery Ward Catalog Fall/Winter 1929 - 30, with a very fancy lace collar and matching jabot.

In the photograph below right are a couple of my estate sale finds. The fancy lace jabot looks similar to the one on the red dress, but is probably earlier than the Model A years of 1928 - 1931. It is completely hand made and unlikely to have been made for mass purchase.



The jabot with the cameo pin is also hand made, but is more modern looking. Many jabots look like fancy handkerchiefs folded and pinned to the bodice front. Before you pin, remember that pins leave holes that often cannot be repaired.

In the photo at near right is a modern dress with a triangular bertha collar. The small amount of vertical gathers I put in the collar near the neckline created a slight jabot-shaped drape that added a hint of "vintage." Pinning on the jabot, far right, really cranked up the vintage look.



Bertha Collars

Bertha collars, also known as "cape collars," are cape like overlays that attach at a dress's neckline and extend over the shoulders. Often of voile, organdie, lightweight silk or very sheer cotton, bertha collars add a flutter of movement to an afternoon or evening frock. Sleeveless dresses often had bertha collars that gave them, "the satisfactory feeling of sleeves without any of their discomfort for warm days," according to Modern Pricilla, July 1929. In other words, the wearer gets to hide some skin in comfort and add a bit of graceful movement.
