

Notes from Our Director

This past December I decided to install a modern upper plate in the '31 Deluxe Roadster. The existing points and condenser hadn't ever given any problems and when my effort produced less than intended results, while sitting alongside the road, the familiar voice of my wife, Jackie, intoned, "if it ain't broke don't fix it."

But that's not a guy's way of doing things. I saw moving the condenser to a cooler location as an improvement, even though the Roadster wouldn't travel more than 500 feet without coasting to a stop *after* I had completed the upgrade.

It was the most confounding dilemma as I tried every solution of which I could conjure. If you're thinking "condenser, dummy, replace the condenser," you're correct. Thank you for your encouragement. But it wasn't until I got to the *fourth* condenser that the engine purred as it should.

Just because a replacement part is new doesn't mean that it is functional. The tendency is to blame foreign manufacturing processes. But I recall having the same problem in 1971, long before overseas parts were commonplace, while restoring a 1948 Ford Two Door Sedan. That issue resolved itself when I installed the *fifth* condenser.

One of our club's founding members, Ray Besch, has been kind enough to share his NAPA parts list which includes reference numbers. It appears elsewhere in this issue of the SSA's Newsletter. Ray is quick to say that this list is a hand-me-down with some additions of his own choosing.

The value of Ray's list is that these are parts which have proved themselves over time. The list has grown, as numerous A Model hobbyists have added to it. It might not be perfect but it's a time saving reference guide. A guide which, if kept in the car, just might be what allows any of us to give the 'thumbs-up' sign while parked along the road side some bright summer day.

The Tech Corner

Things That Go Bump In the Night - Part 2

"The original clutch release arm"

The second part that should be of some concern is the original clutch release arm. These parts don't fail with the regularity of the fans, but I have seen two failures in our club (one of which was yours truly) and have heard of several others. These arms will split at the hole for the pin that secures it to shaft. This is usually caused by a crack initiating adjacent to the hole where there is very little material (see photo).



The crack propagates until there is not enough material to carry the load and it fractures when you depress the clutch pedal. The clutch pedal will not return, and you have lost your ability to disengage the clutch not fun when you are on tour a long way from home.

Again the aftermarket has come to the rescue. There is a very good replacement arm available. (see photo).

This part is fabricated from steel, is very stout, and a little bonus is that it is a little longer than the original arm resulting in less pressure required on the clutch pedal. I don't think it is necessary to replace the original part immediately like the fan, but I would recommend inspecting the original part and carrying a replacement part and pin with you when touring. One last thing. Your car is still drivable with the broken release arm. You obviously have to start the car in gear, and it takes a little finesse with the gas pedal when shifting gears, but it



can be done. --- See you on the road, Jim Johnston






