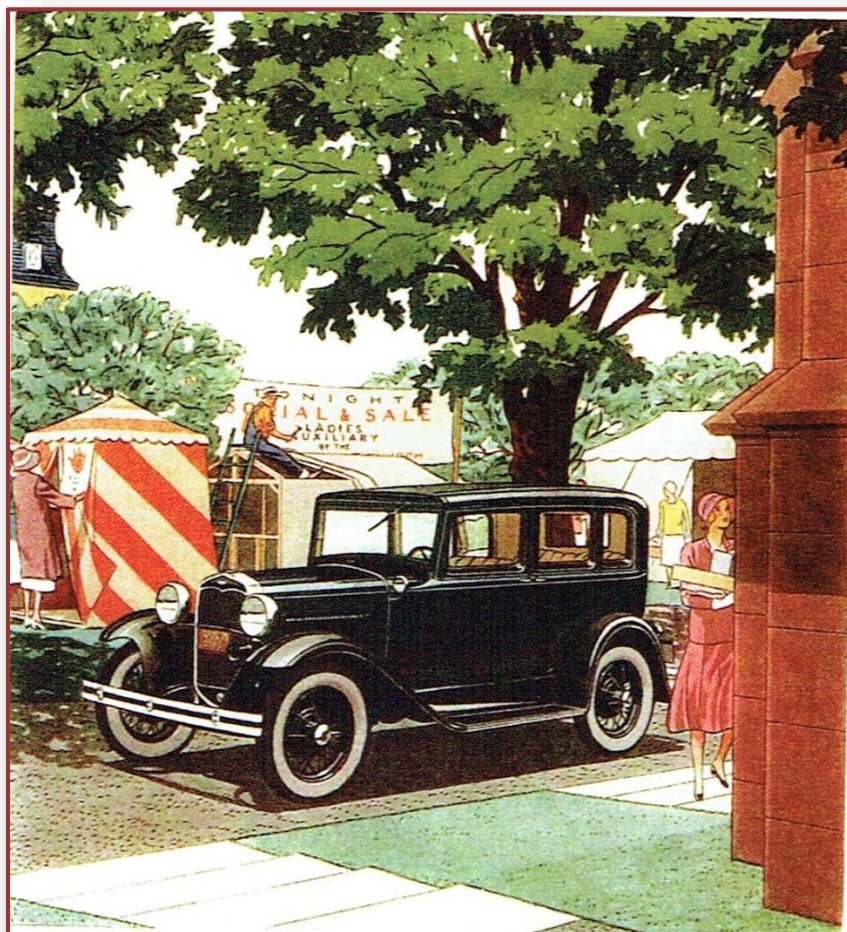

I was fascinated to see the ad at left, for P and G White Naphtha Soap, on the back of Needlecraft magazine. The title reads, "Wanted at once ~ a dependable Arctic "washlady." What follows is a letter to P and G from a woman living in



Wanted at once - a dependable Arctic "washlady"

Alaska, near the Arctic Circle, who raves about the product in helping her with her wash day for a family of seven. She describes the four children, "who hunt and fish, ski and skate, slide, hike on showshoes and go to school!" In winter, which lasts 10 months, they melt the snow for the washtubs, as long as it is clean and not salty. Otherwise, the boys hitch up the dogs and drive to some fresh-water creek miles away to saw out ice and haul it home. That, too, must be melted for the washtub.

The local "washladies" depicted in the ad apparently were not always consistently dependable, or arrived with small children in tow, necessitating a lot of attention; this naturally cut into washing time. So the writer was expressing her gratitude at being able to have P and G soap when she was left to the chore; she said it meant less "elbow grease" in cleaning the laundry.

What a window into everyday life in a locale not usually associated with the Model A era. I loved reading about this woman's day to day activities in a harsh climate, but also took special note of how nicely she was dressed for the occasion! (perhaps just a touch of editorial license from the advertiser...) But just imagine her final washing step - hanging the clothes indoors to dry. If they were hung outside they would simply freeze stiff as a board, or rip to shreds from the wind. Now that's doing "chores!"

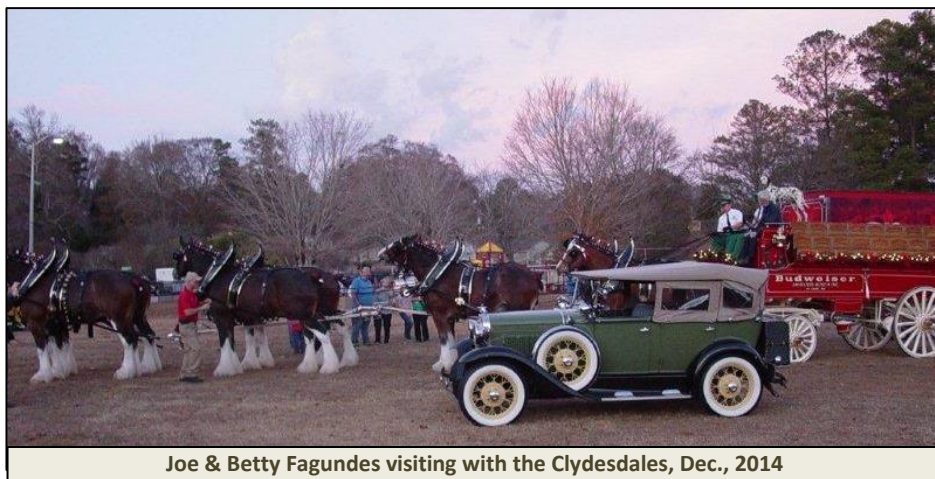

A Slippery Subject

By Jim Johnston

Oil, or more specifically the oil we use in our Model A's, has always been a little bit of a controversial subject. Most of us have strong opinions on the oil we use, some of them justified with technical substantiation, but most of them just opinions. The purpose of this article is to pass along some information that may help you decide which oil you think best for your 'A'.

I am currently rebuilding Ford 200 cu/in six for Jackie's Falcon. I purchased a rebuild kit through the shop where I had the machine work done. The kit is from Melling – a well know manufacturer of aftermarket engine parts especially oil pumps (think Melling sponsorship on Bill Elliot's NASCAR Fords back in the day). Included in the kit was a new cam and lifters. Packed with the cam was a pamphlet with information on cam shaft break-in for flat tappet cams. Included was a list of oils with higher levels of wear preventative additives – (the pamphlet doesn't state it but I suspect the quantities are PPM (parts per million) as this has been the case in similar comparisons.

The other source for this article is from a book I read this past year by Jim Brierley - 4-Bangers and me! Jim is very well known for his work on Model A & B Fords. In addition to his involvement in the MAFCA and MARC sanctioned group called F.A.S.T (Ford A Speed Technology) he has been grinding high performance cams for these engines since 1970. The following paragraph is from the book and reprinted here with Jim's permission.

“Oil: Use good modern engine oil. Never use non-detergent oil, even during break-in. There is no need for added zinc either.” The Model A has a steel cam and hardened lifters, and very little valve spring pressure as compared to post 1940's OHV V8 engines. In the 50's the only engine that wasn't experiencing cam wear was the Buick V8, because it had a steel cam. (not cast iron) There have been a lot of articles written about oils, but most do not apply to the Model A. Today's oils still have zinc in them, just not at the levels they had before catalytic converters. Oil available when the 'A' was new had no zinc or other additives, this resulted in wear and sludge build-up inside the engine. Modern oils have additives that our engines do need, use good oil!”

So, my intent here is not to recommend any particular oil or oils, but to make available information that may be helpful when choosing engine oil for your 'A'.

Note: If you are interested in Jim Brierley's book I have his contact information. It is \$24 postage included.
