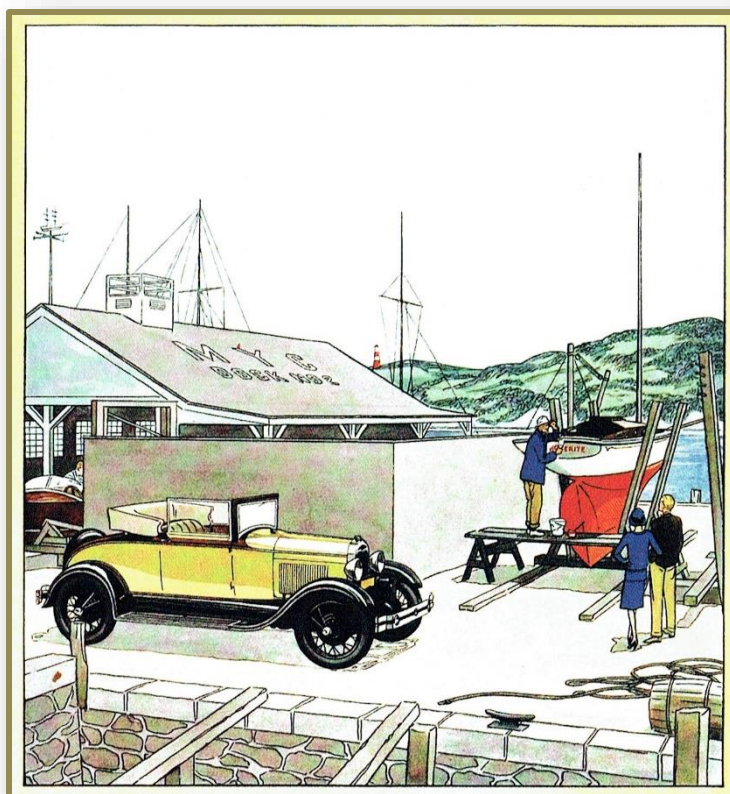

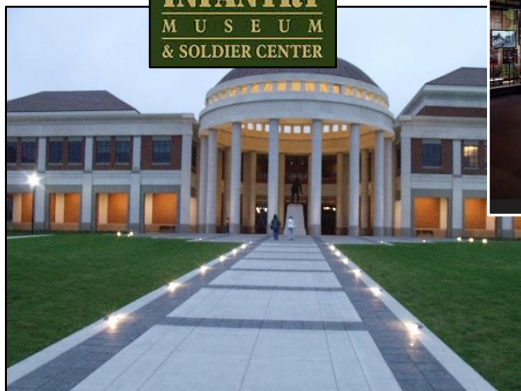
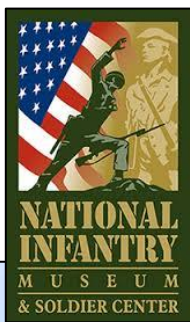

DISTRIBUTOR NOTCH

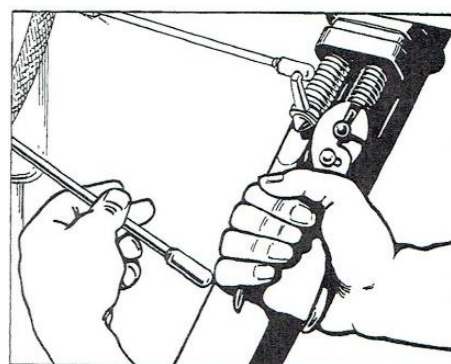
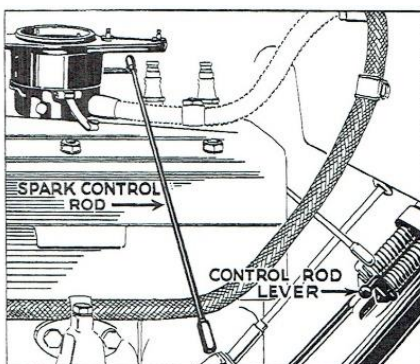
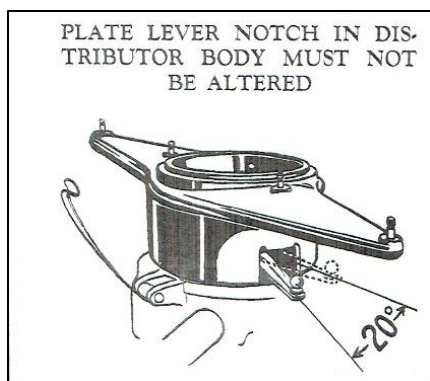
(EDITOR'S NOTE: This month we begin monthly tech tips from our members – real life experience and know-how. If you have a tip you'd like to share, send it to our Tech Chair, Tom Romine at modelatom@comcast.net.)

Henry's Service Bulletin's tell us '**Plate lever notch in distributor must not be altered**'. In timing your engine the 'spark control rod lever' should have full travel up and down on the quadrant and have full motion in the distributor body notch, just short of the ends of the notch in the distributor body.

I measured 5 different distributor body notches. Guess what. All 5 measured differently, from as small as .790 inch to as large as 1.05 inches. Per Diagram Fig 950, we are to have 20 degrees of travel. Which dimension gives us 20 degrees of travel? We have ¼ inch difference. To the best of my calculations, I have found that 1.00 inch will give us a full 20 degrees of travel.

If you have a Spring Back Action on your 'spark advance lever', either your arm is not centered in the distributor notch or the notch is too short. You can file the notch wider, to get the correct width or travel. Don't overdo it stay right at the 1.00 inch dimension. If the notch measures 1.00 inch, then the Service Bulletin says to 'bend' the 'control rod lever' Fig 951 and 952. However, today's aftermarket 'control rod levers' are very flimsy. Look out – they will break very easily. So what do you do.....? Be very, very careful.

Now for a two tooth column, my way is to loosen the steering column tube. Loosen the two screws inside under the gas tank (that holds the clamp around the column). Then loosen the clamp bolt under the hood (on the clamp at the bottom of the column). The column may be tight due to dirt or rust. Then just twist the column, clock wise or counter clock wise, to bring the travel, on the arm, where you want it. No chance of breaking the 'control rod lever.'



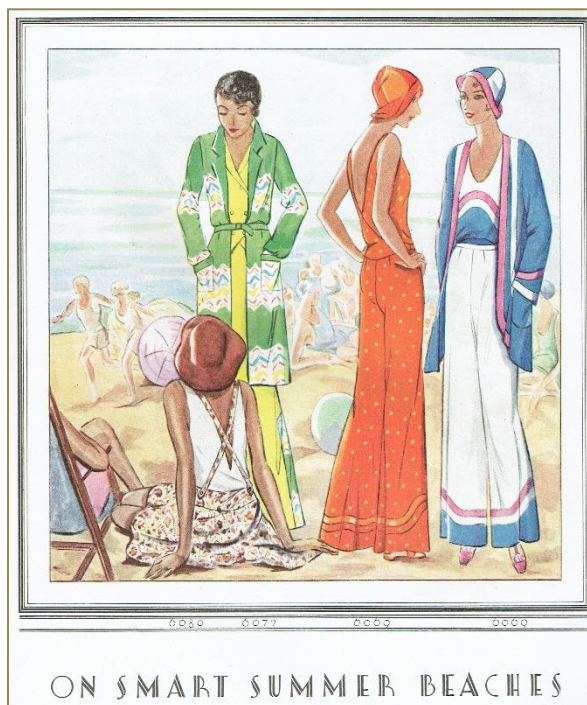
FASHION FINDS... *By Gwyneth Shotwell*

Continuing our efforts to offer easy ways to have fun with era fashions, here are a couple of examples of ladies pants. Since most of us rarely wear dresses, the prospect of developing a dress outfit from the Model A era can seem daunting.

Pants were often seen in the lounging or beach "pajama" style. These tended to be flowing and feminine, and either colorful and playful, or more monochromatic...whichever suited one's personal style.

A brief search on Google for sewing patterns produced this McCall's pattern for pants, that can be easily paired with a soft blouse and draping sweater that can often be found at Ross Dress for Less, T.J. Maxx, etc.

The other advantage to creating a pants outfit is that the shoe portion is a bit easier than for dresses. Simple white canvas Keds are perfectly appropriate, and a simple ballet flat would blend in as well.

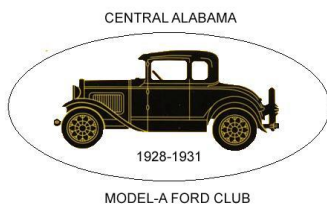

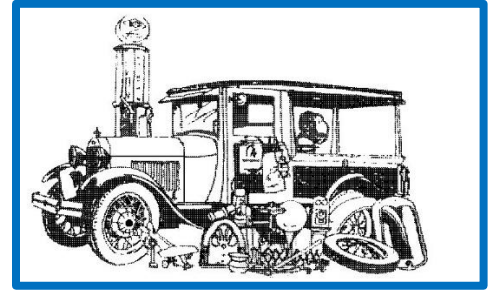
