

This stately, magnificent home will be stunningly decorated for Christmas, a sight to behold. A tour inside and around the gardens is an experience you don't want to miss...even if you have visited at other times of the year.

The dates are **Monday, December 4 to Wednesday, December 6**, with the tour of the Biltmore on Tuesday.

Lunch Bunch Day-tour, October 19, 2023

Wonderful Trilith Tour & Lunch

Our last Lunch Bunch of the year may not have seen us driving the back roads of Georgia, but instead we were treated to a tour of an incredible establishment in our own backyard. We gathered at the border of Peachtree City and Fayetteville to visit the Town at Trilith and the impressive Trilith Studios.

Our tour began with a short film outlining the original development of the studios under the Pinewood Atlanta Studios banner, with construction racing against the clock to be ready for their first production, Marvel's *Ant Man*, in 2015. Pinewood sold its stake in the partnership it had with Dan Cathy's (Chick-fil-A) investment group in 2019, and it was rebranded as Trilith. The vision for the studios and the town is to promote "live, work, play," all within the same community.

The Studio part of the tour showed just how large it is, in fact, the second largest such facility in the world with 34 sound stages. We were able to go inside one that was vacant, and got to see what 40,000 square feet looks like; HUGE. A unique feature of Trilith Studios is the fact that all manner of vendors providing services for movie and TV production have their own facilities right there. This makes the enterprise a One-stop Shop. We learned that they are booked with projects through 2027. Remarkable.

Across the street we drove through the still developing residential/commercial town that is billed as representing the "new urbanism." Dense housing dotted with multiple "pocket parks," one can live within walking distance of multiple amenities including restaurants, fitness, food shopping, retail, and more. They are building a huge facility designed for future movie premieres; Passion City Church, Piedmont Wellness, and a unique short-stay hotel (partnering with Marriott) can also be found as part of the development. It's definitely unlike anything else we've seen south of Atlanta, and is worth visiting.


Our A's were given special parking in the heart of town, where we walked to our lunch venue, Barleygarden. This is a friendly restaurant with good food, a retail wine shop, and additional seating on a second-story open deck. They handled our group of 28 beautifully. Afterwards several of us availed ourselves of delicious gelato at the shop next door, and sat outside watching the passing people; strolling down the street to check out some of the shops rounded out the afternoon, which was blessed with perfect weather.





We discussed the workings of the front axle and the relationship each component had to do with the steering of our cars.... what effects the Toe-in, the Camber and the Caster have to do with steering. We then took apart the axle looking at the various parts, to see if anything was amiss. We found several places that were warn, and discussed how to fix that situation.

Next we looked at the axle itself and found that it was bent in several places (which was causing the steering concerns). We checked the axle with a string and gauge, then bent the axle back into correct shape.

Terry is happy and now he has to paint and put it back together.



The Tech Corner

Grease!

The Model A Ford has numerous grease fittings sticking out all over the car just begging to be greased. However, one area Henry failed to consider is the two parking brake levers on the rear wheels, each with a pair of bushings.

Even though the bushings see little wear, they should be greased. Trying to oil them is difficult. There is a way to install grease fittings. The modification has been around for years and is something worth doing. It is best approached when doing a brake job when the rear brakes are apart.



The above photo shows a pair of brake levers with grease fittings installed. Drill from the end of the shaft with a nominal 1/8" drill bit down to a point between where the two bushings ride and cross drill it. Then drill the end of the shaft with a 5/16" drill bit about 3/8" deep.




Press in type grease fittings and the insertion tool

Press in grease fittings and the tool to insert them can be obtained from Bratton's. The part number for the grease fittings is 36740 and the part number for the drive-in insertion tool is 36810; page 160 in their catalog.

Using the tool, hammer the grease fittings into the end of the shaft where you drilled the 5/16" hole and the shafts are then ready for installation.



The above photo shows a grease fitting in service on a vehicle driven daily. Give it a shot of grease whenever greasing the car.

FASHION FINDS...

This month we continue our review of the necessary chore of doing laundry, as experienced in the Model A era. We take a look at soap/detergents, and the art of drying one's laundry.

Soap

Detergent as we know it today was not invented until 1933. A laundress needed to be a simple chemist. Soap used for laundry needed to be flaked, so that it could be dissolved in water. It could be purchased already flaked. If flaked soap was not available, bar soap was flaked by



using a soap flaker. The picture at left shows a basic hand-cranked soap flaker. The soap was dissolved in hot water and whipped to a foam. Soap jelly could also be made by mixing flakes, water and borax. This mixture was heated on the stove. Soap beads were new on the market in the Model A era. They were supposed to dissolve in water instantly. A laundress also needed to be familiar with bluing, starch, acids, alkalis and how to soften water.



Clothes Washing

After soaking, washing the clothes with soap was the next step. Then, they had to be rinsed two or three times. The washing machines of the era didn't have a rinse cycle. The water would have to be emptied and refilled each time. After washing and between rinses, the clothes were put through a ringer; either electric or hand cranked.



Clothes Drying


For the most part clothes were hung to dry outdoors or inside on racks during inclement weather. There was a clothes dryer patented in 1892, but it basically was a ventilated device that sat on top of a stove with a hand crank. The type of dryer we use today was not sold until 1938.

**Next month we'll get to the last step in our process, that of ironing. It certainly makes us appreciate our modern, carefree fabrics.




