

"The 3rd (not necessarily annual) Fun with Dick and Jane" tour over the weekend of September 18-20 was once again a delightful mix of congenial company, terrific historical venues and, of course, good food. We numbered around 40 people and 21 Model A's, and the weather gods knocked themselves out just for us - it was perfect. We were also made up of people from four states, Georgia, Alabama, Florida and S. Carolina, so this tour's reputation has spread far and wide.

Many of us began out of the Senoia area for a scenic drive to Social Circle and a delicious lunch at the famous Blue Willow Inn. We were met there by several other Model A's and their drivers, adding to the size of our group. After lunch we headed out towards Washington, with our first stop being the Callaway Plantation. The centerpiece of this open-air museum is a brick 1860's mansion, but the first structures built were a 1785 log cabin and a 1790 Federal

period home. The 1871 one-room schoolhouse was open and airy and made we want to sit at a desk and recite the alphabet! A few visitors played snippets of tunes on the piano, highlighting the great acoustics. And something new to me was the "blackboard paint" on all the walls, complete with white lines for writing and chalk in the trays below.



After our visit we headed into Washington proper, and our lodging for the weekend, the historic Fitzpatrick Hotel on the main square. The large rooms and high ceilings definitely harkened back to another era. Dinner was in one of the dining rooms and was a terrific catered buffet. We had the chance for everyone to introduce themselves, further

enhancing our enjoyment of what a truly great group it was. In fact, two of the couples have since joined the Southside A's!

Saturday morning we headed out for several stops of interest, the first being the Robert Toombs house, just a couple of blocks from the square. Toombs was an ardent secessionists, although much of his political career had been dedicated to preserving the Union. He served as secretary of state for the Confederacy and after the war continued his service both in the U.S. Congress and also here in Georgia as one of the leading architects of the state's Constitution, developed in 1877. We were met at the Toombs house by local historian, Ray Chandler, author of "The Last Days of the Confederacy in Northeast Georgia," who spent the day

with us offering historical insights at the various stops.








The morning continued with visits to the Washington-Wilkes Historical Museum; the site of the Revolutionary War Battle of Kettle Creek; and then the Watson Mill Bridge State Park, home of the longest covered bridge in the state. We had a great lunch at picnic tables reserved for us, next to the South Fork River.

The afternoon consisted of scenic drives through the postage-stamp size town of Philomath and on to Alexander Stephens State Park. The home of Alexander Stephens, who served as vice-president of the Confederacy, among many other achievements, was a lovely, open and inviting place, and the tour we received was outstanding. Our guide had an obvious love of her subject and all those in attendance were impressed with her presentation.

We arrived back at the hotel at the end of a long day, ready to enjoy the camaraderie of our group at the Jockey Club across the square from the Fitzpatrick. There was much convivial conversation over drinks and sweet teas, followed by a tasty dinner, served at perhaps the longest single table I have had the pleasure to sit at. We were one happy group.

The next morning, Sunday, we left at varying times, in varying groups, to head back home. Thanks again to Dick Carne for his continued vision for enjoyable tours, and to Liz Horne, Jackie Johnston and Pat Tyler for all of their individual efforts that brought everything together. We can't wait to see where Dick, Jane and Spot take us next year!




Highlights from the Sept., 2015 Board Meeting

The meeting was adjourned at 7:20PM.



The Tech Corner

Model A Q&A'S October 2015


What a great hobby we all enjoy. Just think of it, we keep these Model A's on the road, enjoy driving them on beautiful days. We get to go places we perhaps may never go, always being greeted with a smile and a wave from passersby. It's fun to work on them, learning new things, and making them better. Then if we do it right, we can consider these old cars an investment, maybe earning a little money over the years, much more fun than a bank CD. And the best part of all is how these old cars tend to pull the family together. Rarely can you start one up without someone wanting to go for a ride.

Q: I have a 1931 Deluxe Roadster that was repainted several years ago. The car looks nice, but it does not have pinstripes. Can I use pin striping tape? How will I know what color to use?


A: I would suggest hand-painted pinstripes. If you are in North Georgia, contact me and I will refer a young man who does a great job on all the cars in our shop. Get a copy of the Model A Paint and Finish guide, available at Mike's "A" Ford-able. This has good diagrams of each model and how the pinstripes should look, and what color goes with each paint scheme. Generally you match the colors of the wheels.

Q: I am working on my 1929 Tudor. I would like to install a new top. I see the top kits are available, is this something I can do myself?

A: I believe with a little patience, some basic tools, and a good plan of action, you should be able to handle this. One thing to look out for, if your top is old and has been leaking then the wood will probably need to be replaced. This can be a bigger job than the actual top. I believe **the "Les Andrews Model A Mechanics Handbook Vol. II**" has some pretty good information about this job.


Alabama and will feature spectacular scenery, county back roads, and local attractions.



You are invited to attend the **Central Alabama Model "A" Ford Club's Museum tour on November 6-7, 2015** with the start point in Oxford, Alabama. The tour will take us back in history with visits to one of a kind and world famous museums in the State of Alabama. The registration fee of \$20 per person includes admission at all museums and a country style buffet lunch on Saturday. If you're Model "A" Ford is not up and running come in your modern car.

FRIDAY November 6, 2015: Starts with arrival and check in at the Quality Inn in

Oxford Alabama. You will be able to visit local antique stores/malls looking for those great finds you just cannot do without. The fun continues Friday evening at 6:00 p.m. with some good "ole" Model "A" fellowship, 50/50 drawing, great door prizes, picking & grinning with the Blue Grass Buddies, and the famous "FIREHOUSE DINNER" featuring a Spaghetti supper with homemade desserts in Gerald Grizzard's Model "A" Ford Museum, 1709-G Hillyer Robinson Pkwy S. After the Confederate Memorial tour we head out to the John Looney house. The two-story log house with double dog-trot is a rare example of pioneer architecture in Alabama. The house was restored by the St. Clair Historical Society in 1974 and is listed in the National Register of Historical places. After the Looney house tour we're off to the "Beans & Greens" restaurant for a country style meal. After lunch we head to Anniston, Alabama, for a tour of the Museum of Natural History and the Berman Museum. When you arrive, park as directed in the reserved area. The Museum of Natural History with its Egyptian artifacts includes mummies, and a Ptolemaic period collection. The Berman Museum of World History with its 8,000 artifacts features oil paintings, intricate jade sculptures, and expressive Remington bronzes. The second floor houses a world famous collection of ancient/modern weapons and military items from various periods. At the end of your self-guided tour you will be free to depart for home or head back to the motel for a Sunday morning departure. This will complete another great tour on the MODEL "A" HIGHWAY.
