



Aligning the Body, Hood and Frame

At any given gathering of Model A's, a visual inspection will no doubt reveal that a number of our cars have alignment issues. Hood and door alignment can usually be traced to one or another frame related issues. While the following are not always dispositive resolutions in 100% of problem situations, they may at least touch on one or more symptoms and yield corresponding resolutions to some varying degree in a majority of instances. For those brave souls who are restoring cars, it is strongly recommended that before disassembly, a careful review of hood and door alignment issues be noted, and pictures of problem areas be taken for later review and repair.

Hood Alignment:


Many cars today represent an assemblage of parts and pieces, sometimes with a frame from one car, the body from another, and so on (for example, there are parts from over thirteen different cars that were used on just body and interior-related components for our '29 fordor). In those instances, it should be noted that the front cross member on earlier car frames has a lower "boss" or mount for the radiator than does the front frame cross member that was used on '30 - '31 cars. In those instances where a '30 - '31 car rests on a '28 - '29 frame, unless the radiator is properly leveled, more times than not there will be a wider gap at the bottom of the hood where it meets the cowl. In those instances, the "problem" can often be remedied by using only a piece of friction tape under the radiator mounting location instead of the traditional use of pads under the radiator. Conversely, a tight hood clearance or overlap in a '29 - '29 car can sometimes be traced to having used a later model '30 - '31 frame (of front cross member) under an earlier '28 - '29 car. The most amenable solution in those instances is to shim the radiator by adding additional rubber pads under the radiator mounting area.



A wider gap at the rear bottom hood area can also be the result of a sagging frame in the area around the rear motor mounts. This is not an uncommon problem, and can usually be traced to having both the majority of the engine's weight being concentrated in this area, as well as the repeated downward thrust caused by the engine's acceleration over a prolonged period of use (more commonly resulting in a greater sag on the right frame rail than the left) [we'll discuss repairs for this situation in our next technical review].

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
Another common occurrence is evident where the hood gap on one side is wider on one side on top than the other. In these instances, the most common remedy is to double check the number of shims used on either side of the radiator, taking out those on the side having the widest gap, or a combination of taking out shims on this side, while adding shims to the other side.

Under the heading “Everything old is new again,” I’ve brought together some vintage advertising with something much more recent.

With the debut of the new movie, “*The Great Gatsby*,” the fashions depicted in the film have inspired new designs based on that era. And while we are used to that phenomena with women’s clothing, we don’t always see the same thing with men’s apparel.

But with “*Gatsby*” the costume designers paired up with Brooks Brothers, a high-end, originally just men’s, clothing company that was established in 1818, as inspiration for the film. 7th Annual Sweet Home Alabama Tour Oct 17-19, 2013


The Central Alabama Model "A" Club's Seventh Annual Sweet Home Alabama Tour will highlight the beauty of Alabama's Gulf Coast. The Tour will be conducted as a hub tour from Mobile Alabama and will feature spectacular Gulf Coast scenery, county back roads, local attractions, and great seafood.

A great 3-day lineup of touring is planned this year. Thursday morning we're off to Dauphin Island, then on a driving tour of the shrimp boat manufacturing plants, and ending up at the famous Light House Restaurant for lunch. In the afternoon we will tour the Bellingrath Gardens and Home. Friday morning we saddle up and head out to the Jim Henderson Antique Automobile Museum. This private collection contains many automotive artifact and over 60 antique vehicles. There are some real gems in the museum including a 1940 Packard Limo used to transport Bogart, an aluminum 1929 Lincoln, Liberace's Rolls Royce and a host of others, then on to the Christmas Town & Village. 




